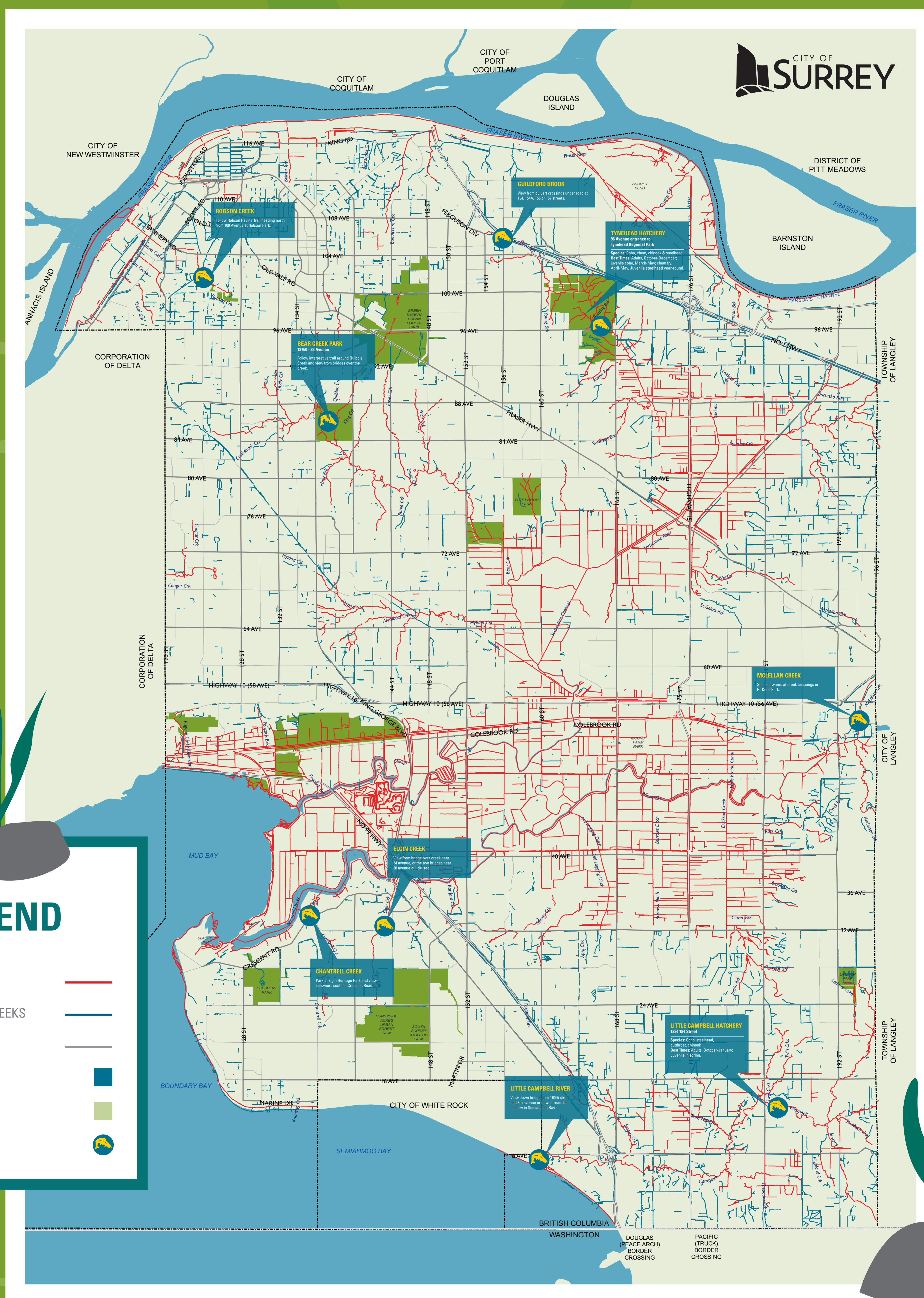


# SPOTTING Salmon IN THE CITY

With over 1400 kilometres of streams and creeks in the City, Surrey contains much habitat important for aquatic species including salmon and trout. The map indicates all the streams where salmon and trout live (shown in red) as well as all the other streams that flow into the salmon-bearing streams that provide the vital food and nutrients (shown in blue).

There are certain places in the City where it is easy to view salmon if you visit at the right time of the year. At the top of this list are the two hatcheries in the City where you can learn all about the entire salmon life cycle and view the young salmon fry as well as returning spawning salmon. In addition there are great community locations near to each neighbourhood centre where you may be able to view the spawning salmon in the fall (October-December).
