SUBJECT: Award of Contract No. 1720-019-11

King George Boulevard Arterial Paving and Intersection Improvements

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Engineering Department recommends that Council:

- 1. Award Contract No. 1720-019-11 to Crown Contracting Limited in the amount of \$4,856,219.03 (including GST), for King George Boulevard Arterial Paving and Intersection Improvements;
- 2. Set the expenditure authorization limit for Contract No. 1720-019-11 at \$5,342,000.00 (including contingencies and GST); and
- 3. Authorize the General Manager, Engineering to execute Contract No. 1720-019-11.

INTENT

The intent of this corporate report is to seek Council's approval to award an agreement for the King George Boulevard Arterial Paving and Intersection Improvements, as illustrated on the map attached to this report as Appendix "I".

DISCUSSION

Scope of Work

The construction package related to this contract consists of the installation of bus queue jumper lanes along King George Boulevard between 72 Avenue and 74 Avenue to reduce transit travel time by providing lane improvements that allow buses to bypass traffic queues waiting at intersections. The proposed works at the intersection of King George Boulevard and 72 Avenue are illustrated on Appendix "II".

In addition, this contract includes the construction of a new signalized intersection at 73 Avenue, repaving of King George Boulevard, and conversion of on-street bike lanes to off-street facilities through the intersections to improve safety for road users.

The contract permits construction from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, in compliance with the *Surrey Noise Control Bylaw*, 1982, *No.* 7044, which provides balance between traffic disruptions and disruptions to residents and businesses.

Invitation to Tender Results

Tenders for the subject contract were opened on December 8, 2022, with the following results:

The Engineer's (ISL Engineering and Land Services Ltd.) pre-tender estimate was \$5,139,193.50 (including GST).

Evaluation

The submissions were reviewed for accuracy and completeness. No errors were found. All submissions included the required 10% bid bond and were signed on the Tender Form.

The low bidder, Crown Contracting Limited, has provided a Consent of Surety for a Performance Bond and a Labour & Materials Bond, and agreed to complete the work within 125 working days, as stipulated in the contract. Crown Contracting Limited's past performance on similar work has been satisfactory. They have no outstanding legal claims against the City. It is recommended that Crown Contracting Limited be awarded Contract No. 1720-019-11.

Project Schedule

The contract work is expected to start in February 2023 and be completed by July 2023.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The work of this contract supports the objectives of the City's Sustainability Charter 2.0. In particular, this work relates to Sustainability Charter 2.0 theme of Infrastructure. Specifically, this project supports the following Desired Outcomes ("DOs") and Strategic Direction ("SD"):

- Transportation DO1: An integrated and multi-modal transportation network offers affordable, convenient, accessible, and safe transportation choices within the community and to regional destinations;
- Transportation DO2: Surrey residents of all ages and abilities have access to active transportation options, enabling them to participate fully in society without the use of a private automobile; and
- Transportation SD11: Ensure the delivery of safe and accessible infrastructure, programs and education to support walking, cycling and transit for all residents.

FUNDING


Funding for this contract is available in the proposed 2023 Transportation Budget.
