BY-LAW NO. 12927

A by-law to amend the provisions of
"Surrey Fire Prevention Fire Prevention
By-law, 1990, No. [10771](#)," as amended.

The Council of the City of Surrey, in open meeting assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. "Surrey Fire Prevention By-law, 1990, No. [10771](#)," as amended is hereby further amended as follows:

(1) Section 1. is amended by deleting the definition of "Indigenous" and inserting the following definition of "Indigenous" in its place:

"Indigenous

Vegetation that was grown on the property."

(2) Section 30. is amended by re-numbering sub-section (j) as sub-section (k) and inserting a new sub-section (j) as follows:

Notwithstanding other provisions in this By-law, outdoor cooking devices using propane, natural gas or charcoal can be used when permitted by the property owner or agent.

In addition, open fires for the preparation of food using clean wood are permitted in non combustible containers no larger than 1m² with flames no higher than .5m. Such containers must be at least 15m from any building or structure and can only be used between the hours of 10 AM and 10 PM."

2. This By-law shall be cited for all purposes as "Surrey Fire Prevention By-law, 1990, No. [10771](#), Amendment By-law, 1996, No. 12927."

PASSED THREE READINGS on the 30th day of September, 1996.
