The Council met pursuant to adjournment,  
Councillors Shepherd and Kuhn were absent.

A delegation representing White Rock Citizens' Committee waited on the Council and requested support of an application of the Provincial Government for authority to submit a plebiscite to the electors of the proposed White Rock Incorporation area in order to ascertain the wishes of the people in connection with the proposal to incorporate as a city municipality.

Mr. G. W. Bruce Fraser acted as spokesman for the delegation and stated that a petition requesting submission of the matter to the electors by means of a plebiscite had been circulated in the proposed area and that approximately 900 signatures in favour of incorporation had been obtained with approximately 50 signatures recorded as against incorporation.

He drew attention to the result of the last annual municipal elections and pointed out that Councillor McPherson, the incorporation candidate, had been elected with a substantial majority over all of his opponents.

Councillors Shepherd and Kuhn took their seats at this point in the meeting.

Some discussion ensued.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Kuhn

"Whereas a petition has been presented by the residents of the White Rock Area praying that a plebiscite be taken to determine if the majority of such residents favor the incorporation of the area starting at the foreshore at a point south of the State Road, North to the intersection of the State and Campbell River Roads, East on the Campbell River Road to the King George Highway, Northwest on the King George Highway to the Johnston Road, South on the Johnston Road to the North Bluff Road, West on the North Bluff Road to the Bergstrom Road, South on the Bergstrom Road to the foreshore, East along the foreshore to the place of commencement.

And whereas it is desirable that the prayer of the petition be granted and such a plebiscite be taken. Now be it resolved that the Minister of Municipalities (or the Lieut. Governor in Council) be requested to take the necessary action to take a plebiscite of the area herein before defined to ascertain if the residents of the said area favor incorporation. And further resolve that if the plebiscite to be taken as aforesaid favors incorporation of the said area then this Council do appoint a committee of the Council to meet with the Citizens' Committee of White Rock to determine the terms of Secession of the said area and to draft a proposed bill to give effect to incorporation of the said area as a city municipality for final approval of the Council and submission to the Legislature".

Speaking to the motion the Reeve enquired if the borrowing powers of the proposed incorporation area were sufficient to carry on with the White Rock Sewerage By-law.

Mr. Fraser replied that a fact finding committee formed by his organization had been engaged for some months past obtaining facts on incorporation and was satisfied that the proposed area had sufficient borrowing power and adequate sources of revenue to enable it to operate satisfactorily.

The Reeve pointed out that the securities issued in pursuance of the White Rock Sewerage By-law had not yet been sold and that in the event of incorporation the White Rock area would be expected to assume this obligation in

such a manner as to not impair Surrey's borrowing powers.

Mr. Fraser replied that this would be done.

Councillor Shepherd expressed his surprise that this question had been brought up without prior discussion and suggested that the motion be tabled until the next meeting in order to allow the members time for consideration.

Councillor Atchison stated that the wishes of the electors of the remainder of Surrey should receive consideration and that the members were elected to represent them.

The Reeve expressed his belief in democracy and stated that he did not wish to place any obstacle in the way of passing the resolution if the majority of the members were in favour; but that he felt that the members should have an opportunity to study the resolution in order that an intelligent vote might be recorded.

Councillor McPherson contended that the resolution should receive consideration without undue delay.

Councillor Atchison contended that the terms of incorporation should be arrived at prior to submitting the plebiscite in order that the electors would know what they were voting for.

Councillor McPherson replied that the present request was not a new one and that a group of members of the White Rock Citizens' Committee had been studying the matter for the past three months and were now in possession of all the necessary details.

Councillor Adams enquired if residents of that portion of the proposed area to be taken from the present Ward 6 were in favour of incorporation.

Councillor McPherson replied that those whom he had contacted had expressed approval. He pointed out that the object of extending the proposed incorporation boundaries to take in a portion of the Municipality bounded by Johnston Road, King George Highway to Campbell River Road was to provide the proposed city municipality with access to the highway.

An amendment to the motion was

Moved by Councillor Shepherd

Seconded by Councillor Bishop

That the motion be laid over for consideration at the next meeting of the Council.

The amendment was then put to the meeting and was declared carried, Councillors Kuhn, Adams and McPherson recording dissenting votes.

Mr. Fraser expressed his appreciation for the hearing given his delegation and the delegation withdrew from the meeting.

A delegation representing Green Timbers Community Association - Came before the Council and presented the following petition:-

"We, the undersigned taxpayers, request the Surrey Municipal Council to institute the following road program in our district:

1. Hard surface Archibald from Trans-Canada Highway to Newton Road.
2. Gravel Nichol Road from Trans-Canada Highway to Newton Road.
3. Complete Waldon Road fill, thus completing Peek, Goldstone and Waldon Road to give east-west access.
4. Complete Kennedy Road from Nichol Road to King George Highway."

Mr. C. A. Porter, acting as spokesman for the delegation, pointed out the difficulties facing milk producers situate on Nichol Road in transporting their produce to market.

Councillor Kuhn asked to be excused and left the meeting at this point.

Mr. Porter drew attention to the dangerous condition of the bridge across Bear Creek on Nichol Road. He suggested that it should receive immediate attention.

He also pointed out that the creek adjoining his property is in need of attention to prevent flooding of his property.

He also drew attention to the need for brushing on Nichol Road adjoining Bear Creek Park and pointed out the danger created by fallen trees overhanging the road allowance.

Councillor Johnston informed the delegation that most of the requests mentioned in the petition were on the current year's works programme and would receive consideration as finances and equipment permitted.

The Reeve pointed out that funds available for Board of Works expenditure were limited and that it was not practical to spend it all in one Ward.

The delegation was assured that their requests would receive consideration and the best possible showing would be made with the funds available.

CORRESPONDENCE WAS READ AND DEALT WITH AS FOLLOWS:

Mrs. Gertrude L. Wark - Enquiring regarding extension of water service, also requesting that attention be given to Columbia Road between Ewen Avenue to Cambridge Street and to Cambridge Street between Columbia and Dumfries Drive.

Referred to Councillor Bishop.

Mrs. Anna Nilson - Reporting that the culvert crossing Railway Street at Alexandria Creek is completely blocked and requesting early action to remedy the condition.

Councillor Bishop reported that this matter had been attended to.

Mr. & Mrs. R. Hayes - Requesting opening of North Line Road between Clow Road and Johnston Road.

R.M. Hayes and others - Enclosing petition requesting opening of North Line Road between Clow and Johnston Road.

Referred to Councillor Bishop for consideration in connection with the current year's works programme.

R. J. Shears and others - Petition requesting opening of Westminster Road between Bon Accord Road and Holley Road.

Councillor Bishop reported that this work should be done and the Clerk was instructed to advise Mr. Shears that an effort would be made to complete the opening of Westminster Road as soon as weather conditions and availability of machinery permitted.

M. L. Neufeld and others - Petition requesting widening of Westminster Road from Highway Junction East.

Councillor Bishop reported that he had discussed this matter with one of the petitioners.

The Clerk was instructed to advise that in view of the limited funds available for public works it was extremely unlikely that the matter could receive attention this year.

M. F. Coumont - Offering \$50.00 as purchase price of Lots 18 and 19, Block 43, Port Mann, Map 2546.

Referred to Councillor Bishop for investigation and report.

Victoria Tile & Brick Supply Co. Ltd. - Requesting attention to Archibald Road to enable them to haul bricks from their plant.

Councillor Johnston reported that the Archibald Road was now being gravelled.

The Clerk was instructed to advise the Company accordingly.

W. Wraight - Requesting action in connection with previous requests for a bridge over the ravine on Townline Road west of Scott Road.

Clerk to reply that Councillor Shepherd, the Reeve and the Engineer were to meet representatives from Delta Municipality on Friday morning to discuss the matter.

E. L. Smithman, Secretary, Bridgeview Community Association - Demanding that attention be given to providing a garbage dump for use of the Bridgeview Area.

The Clerk was instructed to advise that it would be possible to use the Roebuck Road allowance on the North side of the Highway, at the foot of the hill for a garbage dump.

The Clerk was instructed to advise the Secretary of the Whalley Business Men's Association of the Council's decision to locate garbage dump on this portion of Roebuck Road.

M. L. Culbert - Requesting construction of the road access to his property - Lot 2, Block 14, SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 32, Block 5N, Range 2W, Map 1943.

It was arranged to do some work on this road during the current year.

Paul Stamberg - Advising that he intends to erect a 65 foot building on Lot 1, Block 2, Section 31, Block 5N, Range 2W, Map 673, and asking the Municipality to move the road to the proper location, stating that if this is not done by the 7th instant, he will close the road without further notification.

Referred to Councillor Shepherd and the Reeve for investigation.

James Carter, Sec-Treas. Strawberry Hill Farmers' Institute - Drawing attention to difficulty experienced in locating Burke Road and requesting erection of road marker signs at the corner of Scott Road and Gladstone, Roebuck and Newton Roads and King George Highway.

Referred to Councillor Johnston and the Road Supervisor for attention.

James Carter, Sec-Treas. Strawberry Hill Farmers' Institute - Advising that his Institute is fully in accord with the stand taken by the Council in rejecting the estimates submitted by the Board of School Trustees.

Ordered filed. Clerk to acknowledge.

John G. Farmer, Secretary, Board of Park Commissioners - Requesting the gravelling of the road through Bear Creek Park in the event that the Council decides not to open Kennedy Road between Nichol Road and King George VI Highway in time to carry the coming Summer's traffic.

Councillor Johnston reported arrangements had been made to gravel the road through Bear Creek Park.

David N. Jamieson and others - Petition requesting opening of Ewenson Road for a distance of half a mile west from Sandel Road.

Clerk to advise that funds available for Board of Works expenditure were limited, but that the petition would receive consideration if funds were available.

J. W. Dunbar - Requesting construction of Serpentine Road between Holmes Road and Coast Meridian Road.

Councillor Atchison reported that he had been in contact with Mr. Dunbar and had made satisfactory arrangements with him.

Correspondence was ordered filed.

J. E. Qualey and others - Petition drawing attention to size of culvert across New McLellan Road which causes flooding of their properties and requesting that steps be taken to remedy this condition during the coming summer.

Councillor Atchison reported that he had made arrangements previously with Mr. Qualey for the carrying out of this work during the coming summer and that Mr. Qualey had agreed to pay the sum of \$50.00 as his share of the cost.

The Clerk was instructed to enquire if this arrangement still stood and to advise that the culvert complained of will receive attention the coming Summer.

Sanders Poultry Farms Limited - Drawing attention to condition of Reid Road and requesting it be graded as soon as possible.

Councillor Atchison reported that this road had already been attended to.

Leslie Eggleton - Requesting early attention to a drainage condition affecting his property at 887 Latimer Road.

Referred to Councillor Kuhn for attention.

A. G. Pudden, Secretary, Crescent Beach Property Owners' Ass'n. Requesting the Council to give attention to providing access to the beach from the Crescent end of Sunnyside Road.

Councillor Adams reported that he had discussed this matter with the Crescent Beach Property Owners' Association and had made satisfactory arrangements with them.

Correspondence was ordered filed.

Mrs. W. Weinman - Requesting removal of roots and debris from the road allowance fronting Lot 13 of Lots 8 and 9 of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 9, Tp. 1, Map 7944, without delay as she wishes to have the lot cleared.

Councillor McPherson reported that he had discussed the matter with Mrs. Weinman.

Correspondence was ordered filed.

Robert Montgomery - Complaint regarding sanitary conditions existing on two lots on the corner of Maple Street and Victoria Avenue, White Rock: Suggesting that the cabins on the property should be condemned as a nuisance and fire hazard.

The Clerk presented a report by Mr. L. J. Burton, Assistant Sanitary Inspector, on conditions existing on the property complained of, stating that sanitary conditions were satisfactory and that no special fire hazard exists.

Mr. Burton's report was ordered filed and the Clerk instructed to forward a copy to Mr. Montgomery for his information.

Councillor McPherson draw attention to sanitary conditions existing in White Rock and these were discussed briefly without any action being taken.

L. J. Burton, Assistant Sanitary Inspector and Fire Inspection Officer - Report on conditions existing on the above property, stating that sanitary conditions are satisfactory and that no special fire hazard exists.

Ordered filed.

F. Wilson, Secretary, New Westminster Board of Trade - Expressing hope that the Council will see its way clear to send Reeve Schultz with the delegation going to interview the Dominion Cabinet regarding improvement of deep sea channels to and development of the port of New Westminster.

The Reeve stated that he did not think the Municipality was justified in spending approximately \$400.00 in sending a member with this delegation.

Councillor Shepherd expressed the opinion that Surrey should be represented and pointed out the need for action to protect Surrey's interests on the south side of the Fraser River.

Further discussion ensued and the correspondence was ordered filed.

Moved by Councillor Shepherd

Seconded by Councillor Johnston

That the Clerk be instructed to make application the New Westminster Board of Harbour Commissioners for appointment of a member on that Board to represent the Municipality of Surrey.

Carried

The Clerk was instructed to forward copy of this letter to Rom Reid, M.P. and request his assistance in this connection.

Secretary, Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada - Enclosing certified copy of Order No. 70299 of his Board, extending the date for installation of the automatic warning signal at the Great Northern Railway crossing over Crescent Road to May 17th, 1948.

Ordered filed.

A. B. Jackson, Secretary, Public Utilities Commission - Acknowledging receipt of the Municipality's submission in connection with the application of B. C. Motor Transportation Limited for an increase in fares and advising that this had been given consideration and the Company's application had been allowed. Also that an adjustment is being made in the new fare to Cloverdale.

Ordered filed.

Councillor Shepherd reported that the Townline Ratepayers' Ass'n. - had requested action by the Council to have the B. C. Motor Transportation Ltd. adjust their schedule on the route serving the Scott and Townline Road area to provide for a bus leaving the corner of Scott and Townline Road at 10 a.m. for the City of New Westminster and to return to that point leaving New Westminster at 2:30 in the afternoon.

The Clerk was instructed to forward this request to the Transportation Company.

J. A. Sadler, Regional Administrator, Department of Welfare - Advising that his Department cannot adopt the 15¢ per capita procedure in administering Social Welfare in Surrey.

Correspondence ordered filed.

Deputy Fire Marshal - Drawing attention to conflicting regulations contained in the "Fire Marshal Act" and "Surrey Building By-law, No. 468" and suggesting that the Council amend the Building By-law to eliminate this confusion.

Clerk reported that a draft of the revised building by-law was in process of preparation and requested permission to obtain legal advice from the Municipal Solicitor.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Johnston

That the Clerk be authorized to obtain legal opinion on revised Building By-law prior to its presentation to the Council.

Carried

Clerk was instructed to advise the Deputy Fire Marshal that the Building By-law would be revised.

Secretary, Board of School Trustees, Surrey District #36 - Advising that his Board had appointed Mr. R. W. Keery to represent them in the arbitration proceedings pending on current estimates of expenditures.

Correspondence ordered filed. The Clerk was instructed to make the necessary arrangements to proceed with the arbitration.

Secretary, Surrey Municipal Employees' Association - Requesting a hearing by the Council in regard to dismissal of Mr. H. J. Stoney and temporary lay-off of the members of the Public Works Department on March 5th, 1948.

It was arranged to meet the Grievance Committee of the Employees' Association on Monday, April 19th at 8 p.m.

Campaign Manager, Conquer Cancer Campaign - Enquiring regarding progress made in connection with the current drive for funds.

Considerable discussion ensued and Councillor McPherson reported that his Committee had been unable to make arrangements for the sponsoring of this Drive.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Adams

That the Clerk be instructed to advise officials of the Conquer Cancer Campaign that it was impossible to organize the current year's drive for funds and that efforts were being made to form a Community Chest Organization to co-ordinate the various appeals of this nature in future.

Carried

A. L. Grant, Secretary, Sullivan Volunteer Fire Department - Enclosing account for four fires outside the Sullivan District which were attended by his brigade and suggesting that the time had now arrived when the Council would have to make definite arrangements for payment before his brigade would answer any fire calls outside the Sullivan District.

Some discussion ensued. The Clerk was instructed to arrange a meeting between members of the Sullivan Volunteer Fire Committee and Councillor Johnston and Mr. L. J. Burton, to discuss the matter fully.

Councillor Shepherd drew attention to a letter received by the South Westminster Fire Committee from the Municipal Treasurer and dealing with procedure to be followed in connection with accounts incurred by that Department. The Clerk was instructed to write the Secretary of the South Westminster Fire Committee and clarify the matter.

Secretary-Treasurer, Ocean Park Branch, No. 27, Old Age Pensioners' Association - Drawing attention to suggestions contained in a letter published in the "Surrey Leader" issue of February 26th, 1948, dealing with the establishing of an Old Age Pensioners' Home. Also petitioning the Council to reserve a site for said Home as near to White Rock as possible and suggesting portion of Semiahmoo Indian Reserve as a suitable site.

Referred to the Welfare Committee for consideration.

B. C. Electric Railway Co. Limited - Enquiry regarding terms on which Lot 96, Block 4, Section 36, Block 5N, Range 3W, Map 529A might be purchased.

Moved by Councillor Adams

Seconded by Councillor Shepherd

That the B. C. Electric Railway Company Limited be permitted to purchase Lot 96, Block 4, Section 36, Block 5N, Range 3W, Map 529A, for the sum of \$50.00

Municipal Engineer - Enclosing proposals for the ditching and drainage of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 5, Tp. 8, and for improving the drainage of New McLellan Road.

Laid over for consideration at the next meeting.

Secretary, Union of British Columbia Municipalities - Enclosing information regarding the proposed distribution of the suggested 3% Sales Tax.

Some discussion ensued during which Councillor Shepherd stated he was opposed to the imposition of the Sales Tax.

The Clerk was instructed to register a protest with the Union of British Columbia Municipalities regarding the suggested method of distributing the proposed 3% Sales Tax.

Correspondence was ordered filed.

Some discussion arose regarding increased rates charged for automobile insurance.

The Clerk was instructed to draw this matter to the attention of the Union of British Columbia Municipalities and also to the attention of Alex Hope, M.L.A.

Pest Control Limited - Enclosing details of the brush control service offered by that Company to the Cities and Municipalities of British Columbia.

Referred to Board of Works Committee.

Alex Podkidailo - Applying for permission to operate his service station 24 hours of each lawful day pursuant to provision of By-law No. 816.

Moved by Councillor Shepherd

Seconded by Councillor Atchison

That Alex Podkidailo be granted permission to operate his Service Station for 24 hours of each lawful day, pursuant to provisions of "Automobile Garage, Repair Shop and Service Station Closing By-law, 1946, No. 816".

Carried

The Clerk was instructed to request the Chief of Police to check on operators who have been granted 24 hour permits pursuant to By-law No. 816.

Municipal Clerk - Statutory notices in pursuante of Section 7 of the "Special Surveys Act" in connection with Blocks 1 to 4, and 6 to 11, inclusive of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 15, Tp. 1, Map 644.

Ordered filed.

G. W. Bruce Fraser - Enclosing copy of Mr. Justice Whittaker's reasons for judgment in connection with the appeal of the Colebrook Dyking District against decisions of Court of Revision of the Assessment Roll.

Ordered filed.

The Clerk reported an application from the Welfare Officer for an increased car allowance.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Shepherd

That the car allowance paid to the Welfare Officer be increased to \$75.00 per month as of April 1st.

Carried

The Clerk presented a letter from the Superintendent of Kensington House requesting an increase of \$25.00 per month in the joint salary of the



Superintendent and Matron.

Referred to the Welfare Committee for investigation and report.

The Clerk requested permission to cancel tax sale proceedings covering the three quarter interest in Lot 7, SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 31, Tp. 2, Map 2966, pursuant to Section 288 (2) of the "Municipal Act".

Moved by Councillor Shepherd  
Seconded by Councillor Johnston

That the tax sale covering a three quarter interest in Lot 7 of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 31, Township 2, Map 2966, be cancelled, that the purchase price be returned to the purchaser with interest and that taxes as they appeared upon the Collector's Roll prior to such tax sale be restored to the said Roll in pursuance of Section 288 (2) of the "Municipal Act".

Carried

The Clerk presented survey plans prepared by Messrs. Eurnett & McGugan showing accretion of land fronting on 26.59 acre portion of Sections 34 & 35, Block 5N, Range 3", Sketch 1016.

The Clerk was instructed to make the necessary application to the New Westminster Harbour Commissioners for a grant of the lands formed by accretion fronting the above described property.

The Clerk reported that Mr. Joseph Dorgan still wished to obtain a lease to the foreshore fronting on 26.59 acre portion of Sections 34 & 35, Block 5N, Range 3W, Sketch 1016.

It was decided to defer consideration of this application pending result of negotiations to acquire title to the land formed by accretion fronting the property.

The Clerk reported receipt of an offer to purchase Lot 18, and the E $\frac{1}{2}$  of Lot 17, Block 12, SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 31, Township 2, Map 2135.

Referred to Councillor Johnston for consideration.

The Clerk reported receipt of the sum of \$30.00 as rental of Lot 9, Block 5, D.Ls 7 & 8, Group 2, Map 546 for the period October 1st, 1947, to March 31st, 1948, and stated that the tenant on the property wished to acquire same and had offered the sum of \$150.00 as purchase price.

Moved by Councillor Shepherd  
Seconded by Councillor Adams

That offer to purchase Lot 9, Block 5, D.Ls 7 & 8, Group 2, Map 546, for the sum of \$150.00 be accepted.

Carried

Clerk presented the written inspection report of F. G. Jones on inspection of tires on Municipal trucks and equipment.

Referred to Labour and Equipment Committee.

The Labour and Equipment Committee reported that applicants for the position of diesel grader operator had been interviewed and recommended that Mr. V. A. Nesbitt of R. R. 6, New Westminster, B. C., be appointed operator of the first machine to be received and Mr. Brisbin of White Rock be appointed operator of the next grader to be received. Salaries in both cases to be in accordance with the agreement with the Surrey Municipal Employees' Association.

Moved by Councillor Johnston  
Seconded by Councillor Adams

That the recommendations of the Labour and Equipment Committee be adopted and that Mr. Nesbitt and Mr. Brisbin be appointed as recommended, services

to commence upon delivery of the two graders.

Carried

Applications for the position of Municipal Engineer - The Labour and Equipment Committee reported that Mr. Grant B. Starr of Nanaimo, B. C., had been interviewed in connection with his application for the position of Municipal Engineer and recommended that he be appointed to this position.

Moved by Councillor Atchison

Seconded by Councillor Johnston

That Mr. Grant B. Starr be appointed to the position of Municipal Engineer as of May 15th and that he be paid the sum of \$260.00 per month for his services.

Carried

The Labour and Equipment Committee drew attention to the necessity of deciding what was to be done with the old speeder shovel, grader and Engineer's car.

The question of disposing of the old speeder shovel was referred to the Equipment Committee for investigation.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Johnston

That tenders be invited for the purchase of the old grader.

Carried

It was suggested that the Engineer's car be repaired as soon as the Municipal garage was equipped to handle the job and that it be retained for Municipal use.

This suggestion was referred to the Equipment Committee for consideration.

Councillor McPherson reported that the Board of Park Commissioners had requested permission to use the Municipal Grader on the Saturday to level out the ball park at White Rock, the operator having agreed to donate his services. Permission was granted.

Councillor Atchison drew attention to charge of \$15.00 per month by E. Preece for disposal of garbage collected in Cloverdale and \$2.00 charge for collection of ashes and rubbish from the Municipal Hall.

He suggested that a charge of \$15.00 per month made for disposal of the garbage collected in Cloverdale should not be a charge on the general revenue of the Municipality.

The matter was referred to the Reeve for investigation.

Councillor Atchison also drew attention to an account rendered by E. Bowman's garage at Port Kells in the sum of \$364.00 for overhauling Mr. J. Closkey's work.

Some discussion ensued and payment of this account was authorized.

Councillor Bishop reported that the question of the hospital site was now decided and enquired if the Municipality was willing to accept the  $4\frac{1}{2}$  acre site offered by the Hospital Committee.

Moved by Councillor Adams

Seconded by Councillor Bishop

That the site offered by the Surrey Memorial Hospital Society be accepted with the understanding that the site is to be an outright gift with no strings attached and the Welfare Committee of the Council is given an opportunity

to select a location.

Carried

Councillor Atchison drew attention to misinformation circulating regarding the Municipality refusing to install private culvert crossings.

The Clerk was instructed to advise the local press that installation of private crossings by the Municipality was only temporarily discontinued until such time as the Municipal works crews were caught up on prior commitments.

Councillor Bishop reported receipt of a request for permission to open up portion of Holmes Road.

This was referred to the Engineer.
