

CITY OF SURREY

BY-LAW NO. 12882

A By-law to enable Council to authorize the expenditure of money for Youth Recognition Awards.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 270 (d) of the Municipal Act R.S.B.C. 1979, C.290, Council may by by-law expend money to honour persons who have, in the opinion of Council, brought honour to the municipality;

AND WHEREAS the Youth Recognition Award candidates have made inspiring contributions to the community;

AND WHEREAS, the Youth Recognition Awards will recognize and promote the positive efforts of youth, as recommended in the April 1994 "Call for Action Report" by the Mayor's Advisory Committee on Youth Violence;

AND WHEREAS the recognition of youth contributions by the community will encourage a greater understanding and acceptance of youth;

AND WHEREAS the Youth Recognition Awards focus on the abilities of youth and help youth see themselves as contributing members of the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Surrey, in open meeting assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. This by-law may be cited for all purposes as "Surrey Youth Recognition Awards By-law, 1996, No. 12882."
2. The General Manager, Finance Department, and his or her authorized designates may expend a sum of \$7600.00 for Youth Recognition Awards, in the following denominations, to the following youth/teams:
 - 1) Joshua Choi - \$400 for outstanding artistic ability and willingness to provide visual support to community events.

 - 3) Jennifer Clark - \$400 for dedication and accomplishments in singing.

 - 5) Erika dela Cruz - \$400 for accomplishments, discipline and dedication in dance.

- 6) Shawn Dempster - \$400 for endless dedication and contributions to environmental causes.
- 7) Sheeba Faqih - \$400 for invaluable community contributions and exceptional qualities of listening, comforting and caring.
- 8) Robin Fry - \$400 for artistic talents and innovative drawing techniques.
- 9) Kate Kanakoglou - \$400 - for courageously overcoming personal obstacles, for exceptional community contributions, and for artistic and philanthropic pursuits.
- 10) Rosa Kasaei-Adl - \$400 for dedication, commitment and significant contributions to school and the community.
- 11) Keri Ann Minty - \$400 for talent, dedication, determination, and artistic contributions in acting, dance, and music.
- 12) Krista Robinson - \$400 for admirable contributions, dedication and enthusiasm to numerous school and community events.
- 13) Jane Shin - \$400 for tireless dedication and inspirational support to the community, to youth, and to the elderly; and for a co-operative, sacrificing attitude that makes her a role model for youth and adults alike.
- 14) Mark Tubbs - \$400 for understanding and achievement in music and composition.
- 15) Mike Dicus and Geoff Armstrong - \$700 for setting up the first B.C. Counter Attack home page on the World Wide Web dedicated to raising awareness of the hazards of speeding, drinking, and driving.
- 16) Holy Cross Regional High School Racism Video Team
(*Jerome Francis, Athena Juneson, Magda Piaseczna, Adora Tang*) - \$700 for promoting racial harmony by developing, on their own initiative, a powerful video documentary outlining the issue of racism and offering solutions to this problem.
