

TENDER RESULTS

In November, 2017, a Request for Quotation (RFQ) was issued to exhibit fabricators and designers who are capable of designing and building a world-class interactive children's space at the Museum of Surrey ("MoS"). The RFQ was posted on the City's Website and on BC Bid. Purchasing received eight responses in total:

EVALUATION

All responses were evaluated through the work of an evaluation team facilitated by the Purchasing Section consistent with the criteria stipulated in the solicitation document as follows:

- (a) Experience, Reputation and Resources;
- (b) Technical; Approach and Methodology, including Time Schedule; and
- (c) Financial.

Based on the above evaluation criteria, including interviews with three shortlisted contractors, the evaluation team concluded that Holman Exhibits Inc. and their subcontractor Reich+Petch (design consultants) have the necessary experience and resources to carry out the Work.

Based on the above, it is recommended that the City award the scope of Work to Holman Exhibits Inc.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

This Contract will support the objectives of the City's Sustainability Charter. In particular, this exhibition project relates to the Sustainability Charter Themes of Education and Culture and Inclusion. Specifically, this project supports the following Desired Outcomes and Strategic Directions:

FUNDING

The City was successful at receiving Federal funding from the Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component – National and Regional Projects of \$4,464,475 for the Museum addition and development of the Heritage Campus in which \$300,000 is designated for design and fabrication of the Kids Explore Zone. The remaining funding is available for this Contract in the approved 2018 Parks, Recreation & Culture Budget.
