From the Editor of the "Ratepayer" forwarding copies of the  
 paper and asking the Council to consider the advisability  
 of subscribing for the same. Referred,

From the Manager, Canadian Bank of Commerce enclosing  
 cancelled notes of the temporary loan. Referred,

From Capt. O. F. Brown saying the ditch put in last  
 summer was washing away some of his land and  
 that his crossing was torn up making it bad to get  
 in with a rig and hoping the matter would be  
 attended to soon. Referred to Co. Murphy,

From C. W. Huntley saying an immense hole had been  
 dug in his barn-yard and his pivot-wood badly  
 damaged by the heavy loads of gravel hauled over it -  
 and wishing to know what the Council are willing  
 to do in the matter. Referred to Co. Sullivan,

From A. H. MacNeill, saying he thought it would be well  
 to pass the by-law closing the old White-Rock Road to  
 all but the fire engine, pending the handing over  
 a cheque for \$700. Referred,

From E. H. McEwen M.L.A. M.H.C. reporting as follows:-  
 Gentlemen,

I am exceedingly glad to report a very  
 clean bill of health for the past year, that there has  
 been so little spread of infectious or contagious disease  
 is a laudable thing ~~and~~ <sup>and</sup> I believe is largely due to the  
 people understanding the necessity of promptly dealing  
 with suspicious cases. I have to report the following  
 cases of contagious and infectious diseases:-

Chicken Pox 3 cases, scabies or Itch 5 cases, measles 1 case. Re Chicken Pox, an epidemic appeared in the Lynnhed school in latter part of May, at this time small Pox was raging in New Westminster. Therefore I deemed it advisable to close Lynnhed school for two weeks for fear that a stray case of small Pox might start an epidemic, no further spread of disease.

The various schools have been visited as occasion demanded and sanitary conditions received attention.
