Moved by Councillor Morton seconded by Councillor Johnston that Councillor Morton be appointed to go and see about road proposed by Langley Council to be gazetted and report at next meeting. Carried. Moved by Councillor Stewart seconded by Councillor Shannon that the following bills be paid for clearing logs out

of roads, Geo Boothroyd \$1.00 W. Stewart .75 A. L. Huck \$1.00 John Woodward \$4.00 J. Johnston \$5.00. Carried Moved by Councillor Stewart seconded by Councillor Shannon that the clerk be instructed to apply to the

Government to have C. A. Carncross, Duncan Mackenzie and Joseph Adams appointed as fence viewers for the Municipality of Surrey. Carried Moved by Councillor Shannon seconded by Councillor Stewart that the clerk be paid \$150.00 on a/c of salary. Carried
