DELEGATIONS:

Mrs. F. A. Hiland - came before the Council and enquired if any reply had been received from the Provincial Department of Public Works in connection with her request for action to complete the crossing from King George VI Highway to her service station.

The letter of Mr. E. S. Jones, District Engineer, dated January 7th, 1947, was read, and it was stated that Mrs. Hiland's application "was given the same consideration as all other applications and that the work carried out conformed to the original agreement with her".

Mrs. Hiland contended that the work had not been completed as per agreement, but that a catch basin had been installed which was not in the original agreement and for which she should not be expected to pay.

The Clerk was instructed to take this matter up with Mr. H. C. Anderson, Assistant Chief Engineer, Department of Public Works, to ascertain what can be done to have the installation completed.

Mr. A. Forbes - came before the Council and requested construction of a section of Pacific Avenue, White Rock, for a distance of approximately one quarter mile East from "F" Street. He stated that he had personally paid for the bulldozing of this section of street, but that it required ditching, gravelling and installation of culverts before he could gain access to his property.

COUNCILLOR RUTLEDGE TOOK HIS SEAT AT THIS POINT IN THE MEETING.

The Engineer reported that it would not be possible to undertake this work until early in the summer.

The matter was given further consideration and on the recommendation of Councillor Graham it was decided to place this project on the works agenda for attention early in the year.

The condition of roads throughout the Municipality and the damage resulting from the recent heavy frosts was discussed to some length.

The Reeve reported that it had been reported that the B. C. Motor Transportation Limited wished to discontinue its bus service along Boundary Road and that residents of the area affected were very concerned over the report as they felt that the service had not been given a fair trial.

The Clerk was instructed to request the Transportation Company to continue this service for at least three months longer in order that residents of this area would have an opportunity of availing themselves of it and that the service would have a fair trial.

Mr. Lawrence Fraser - came before the Council and requested cleaning out of the ditches on Johnston Road to give drainage to his property.
