Council met pursuant to adjournment, all the members, with the exception of Councillor Currie, being present.

The Council took up the question of representations to be made to the Post-War Rehabilitation Council at the public hearing to be held at the Municipal Hall on Saturday, the 8th inst., at 3 p.m.

After considerable discussion the following projects were recommended as worthy of consideration by the Rehabilitation Council in providing for the employment and well being of discharged soldiers and war workers in the post-war period, namely:-

Construction of sewage farms

Construction of homes

Construction of Sanatorium and Hospital

Development of Parks

Construction of Water Systems

Construction of Electric Light and Power Systems

Paving of roads and sidewalks

Conversion of war machinery for use in land clearing & farm work.

Construction of wharves and sheds for fishermen.

Clearing out of jams in rivers used by spawning fish.

Establishment of Community Canning Centres

Establishment of Beet Sugar factories

Establishment of Refrigeration plants

Establishment of brickyards

Dredging and dyking of rivers

Replacement of wooden road bridges by permanent structures.

Establishment of a central grading and clearing station for farm produce.

Resolutions for presentation to the forthcoming Convention of the Union of P.B. Municipalities were discussed and laid over for further consideration.

That the Council adjourn to meet again on Wednesday, the 29th day of July, 1942, at the Municipal Hall, Blowerdale, P.B., at 8 p.m.
