The Board of Police Commissioners met at 2.30 p.m., all the members being present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

D. Sinclair and Constable Mortimer being present, the former reported that on 19th May Constable Mortimer was examined by D. Maden on behalf of the Workmen's Compensation Board; D. Maden was surprised at the improvement shown and advised that the injured foot be left for another six months for further improvement, and to obviate the chances of infection, and that the ankle then be "frozen". The doctor stated that while Constable Mortimer might be capable of some light work it was not advisable that he do any walking.

After considerable discussion, when the question of light work was not found to be practical, it was moved by Commissioner James,
seconded by Commr. McDeth.

That Constable Mortimer continue to be paid the difference between Workmen's Compensation allowance and his salary until further resolution -
Carried.

The Chief of Police reported the engagement of D. J. Matheson as Constable at \$110 per month as from 19th February, 1942 and of J. L. Craig as Constable at \$100.00 per month as from 3rd March, 1942, and that their services had been satisfactory.
