The Municipal Council met at 8.00 o'clock p.m. in Special Session called by notice given in pursuance of the provisions of Section 34 of the "Municipal Act" for the purpose of receiving and considering the report on the survey of the operations of the Corporation made by Messrs. Stevenson and Kellogg Ltd., Management Engineers, and also for the purpose of receiving and considering the programme of work compiled by the Superintendent of Public Works.

All of the members were present with the exception of Councillor Johnston.

Dr. J.C. Hewson and Mr. E.H. Tarrant representing Messrs. Stevenson and Kellogg Ltd., attended upon the Council at the appointed hour and presented the report on the survey of the Corporation's operations which had been carried out in pursuance of the Council's instructions.

Dr. Hewson read the major portion of the report and gave verbal explanations of many points covered in same.

General discussion ensued upon completion of Dr. Hewson's presentation.

That the report on the Corporation's operations compiled by Messrs. Stevenson and Kellogg Ltd., be received, that same be tabled for further consideration and that Dr. Hewson and Mr. Tarrant be invited to attend a future meeting of the Council to discuss the matters dealt with therein in greater detail.

It was arranged that each of the members read through the report with the view of becoming conversant with the contents of same before it again came up for consideration.

Dr. Hewson and Mr. Tarrant then withdrew from the meeting.

The Clerk then presented each member with a copy of the works programme for the ensuing month as compiled by the Superintendent of Public Works.

The programme was considered.

Councillor McPherson suggested that the paving of the southern portion of Bishop Road on a contributory basis with the property owners contributing approximately \$200.00 towards the cost of the work be placed on the programme as the equipment was at present in the immediate vicinity and the work could be carried out efficiently.

That the paving of the southern portion of Bishop Road be placed on the programme of work to be carried out during the ensuing month and that the said work be carried out on a contributory basis as outlined by Councillor McPherson.

After adjournment the members discussed the following matters:

Recommendation of local Manager, Bank of Montreal - that the Reeve visit the Head Office of the Bank of Montreal in Montreal while attending the forthcoming Conference of the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities.

It was decided to recommend to the Council that the Reeve be delegated to visit the Head Office of the Bank of Montreal while attending the forthcoming Conference of the Federation of Mayors and Municipalities.

Application of Mr. J. McArthur on behalf of Jehovah's Witnesses for permission to operate a public address system on streets of the Municipality during period of May 29th to 31st to advertise a religious meeting.

It was decided to recommend that this permission be granted on the usual basis.

The Reeve reported that the R.C.M.P. Detachment had requested the Corporation to erect an addition to the building at Pattullo Bridge to provide office and cells accommodation for a local detachment to be established at that point. He pointed out that if this were done the Municipality would have the privilege of using the men stationed at this point and at present attached to the New Westminster Detachment.

It was decided to recommend that the addition to the building be approved and the Reeve was authorized to negotiate with the R.C.M.P. in the matter.
