The Board of Police Commissioners
met at 2.30 p.m.

Present Peter J. J. Brown presiding
Commissioners Mr Beth and James.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

Councillors Currie and Johnston, representing the Municipal Council, took up with the Commissioners the question of the allowance to Constable W.A. Mortimer of the difference between his salary and his workmen's compensation.

They stated that in making this allowance for upwards of two years the Commissioners had been more than fair to Constable Mortimer and that in the opinion of the Council it should not longer be continued as it was creating a precedent that involved the Council in difficulties when dealing with its outside employees.

The Commissioners pointed out that from reports made last May it had been expected that a definite decision by the Workmen's Compensation Board as to Constable Mortimer's treatment and disability might be expected this coming November, but on a report by Chief of Police Idler of an interview with Constable Mortimer it appeared that a latent infection in the bone had again become acute and Dr. Braden has now stated that it will be impossible to do anything with the leg for at least another year, which altered the whole picture

moved by Commissioner James.

Seconded by Commissioner Brown.

That the payment to Constable Mortimer of the difference between the amount of his workmen's compensation and his salary, be discontinued as from the 1st prox.

Carried.

Moved by Commissioner Mr Beth

Seconded by Leonard Brown.

That Constable Inoffato's car allowance be increased to \$15.00 per month.
