The Council met pursuant to adjournment.
All of the members were present with the
exception of Councillor Shepherd.

Moved by Councillor Graham
Seconded by Councillor Keery
That the minutes of the meetings of September 2nd, 1947
and September 4th, 1947, be respectively adopted as read.

Mr. E. E. Hollis - waited on the Council and presented
a petition requesting the Municipality to take action to complete construction of
the section of Northline Road between King George VI Highway and Nicol Road.

The Engineer reported that opening of portion of this
road from King George VI Highway to the ravine had been provided for in this
year's works programme and that this would be undertaken as soon as possible.

The question of extending the road across the ravine
was discussed and it was pointed out that municipal finances would not permit this
being done during the current year.

The Clerk was instructed to bring this matter to the
attention of the incoming Council.

W. Hornby - came before the Council and requested
opening of portion of Croft Road to give him access to Block 7, NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 7,
Tp. 8, Map 994.

He was advised that municipal finances would not per-
mit the undertaking of this work during the remainder of the current year, and
it was suggested that he take the matter up with the incoming Council.

Messrs. P. J. Gordy and N. Gordy - waited on the Council
and requested that the road leading to their properties in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31,
Township 8, be gravelled to allow them access during wet weather.

They were advised that an effort would be made to gravel
the portion of the road from the Northline Road to the creek and to install the
necessary bridge, if funds and equipment were available.

Chris Renner - waited on the Council and requested
construction of the road along side of Erickson Ditch - north from Brown Road,

He was advised that the Finance Committee would review
the Municipality's financial position during the ensuing week and if finances per-
mitted, an effort would be made to render some assistance in improving the access
to his property.

F. J. Robertson - came before the Council and expressed
his opposition to the recommendations of the Surrey Town Planning Commission to
zone properties on King George VI Highway, between New McLellan Road and Findon's
Electrical Store for small holdings and residential purposes.

He suggested that the Council give this recommendation
serious consideration and requested that the portion of his property extending
for a distance of 300 feet south of Nichol Road be zoned for business purposes.
