Twice each year, Blackie Spit Park is a rest stop for over 300 species of birds and more than 100,000 ducks and geese as they move between southern wintering sites and northern summer breeding grounds.

This park is full of amazing sights and sounds. Its trails will lead you through forest and meadow, along shorelines, and along the dyke to Dunsmuir Community Gardens. If you go exploring on the beach, please remember to tread lightly; it may only look like lifeless rocks, shells and sand, but the beach is home to many living creatures too!

Viewing Tip: Fall migrants start arriving in mid-August; spring migrants in mid-March.
