	Watering golf courses					Stage 2: Water greens and tee areas normally. Water fairways once per week Stage 3: Water greens and tee areas minimally. Fairways must not be watered



GOVERNMENT/SCHOOLS	Sprinkling lawns and grassed boulevards					Stage 1: Three mornings per week Stage 2: One morning per week
	Sprinkling new, unestablished lawns					Stages 1 & 2: Sprinkling outside restricted times requires a municipal permit Stage 3: Only for permits issued in Stages 1 or 2 until permit expires
	Watering flowers, vegetables, planters, shrubs and trees					Stage 3: Only hand watering or drip irrigation
	Operating water play parks and pools					Stages 2 & 3: Only water play parks with user-activated switches can be operated Stage 4: All shut down and winterization deferred until Stage 4 is lifted
	Topping up, or filling, fountains and water features					Stages 2, 3 & 4: All shut down
	Watering school yards, sports and sand-based playing fields					Stages 2 & 3: Water minimally to maintain areas for use
	Watering municipal parks					Stage 2: Once per week Stage 4: Shut down faucets except for drinking fountains with spring-loaded shut off nozzle
	Flushing hydrants					Routine flushing to be scheduled outside restrictions timeframe. Unscheduled flushing only for a health or safety reason
	Washing cars and boats					Stages 1 & 2: Hose must have automatic or spring-loaded shut off nozzle Stages 3 & 4: For safety only (windows, lights, mirrors, licence plates)
