SUBJECT: **Increase of Taxicab Licenses – Late Submission**

RECOMMENDATION

The Corporate Services Department recommends that Council:

1. Receive this report for information;
2. Approve an amendment to the *City of Surrey Vehicle for Hire By-law, 1999, No. 13610*, to authorize the one time increase of 14 taxicab licenses from 473 to 487, as documented in Appendix "I" of this report; and
3. Authorize the City Clerk to bring forward the related Bylaw amendment as described in this report for the required readings and adoption.

INTENT

The intent of this report is to request that Council approve the addition of 14 taxicab licenses to the City of Surrey Vehicle for Hire Bylaw.

BACKGROUND

In 1999, the *Vehicle for Hire Bylaw, 1999, No. 13610* (the "Bylaw") was approved by Council. Surrey's population has substantially increased since then, creating a steady demand over time for increased taxicab service in the City. In response to this demand, a review process was developed by the City through consultation with the taxicab industry. Under the current Bylaw, the number of vehicles which may be licensed in the City of Surrey for use as a Class "A" Taxicab may only be increased by an application to Council from the taxi industry, which would also need to be within the guidelines of the Passenger Transportation Board ("PTB").

The applicant (Taxi Company) is required to first submit their request to the PTB and, if approved, the request would then be presented to Council.

In September 2018, the PTB approved a motion to allow taxi companies to expand their fleets by 15% to provide better service to the public.

DISCUSSION

At the February 11, 2019 Council meeting, staff presented Corporate Report No. R019; 2019 (attached as Appendix "II"), which recommended that Council approve an increase in the total number of Class "A" taxicab licenses in the City of Surrey from 426 to 473. Upon final adoption of Bylaw No. 19779 (scheduled for February 25, 2019), a total of 473 taxicab licenses will be authorized in the City under the current Bylaw.

Subsequent to Corporate Report No. R019; 2019, staff was contacted by Delta Sunshine Taxi (1972) Ltd. advising that they too had applied for and been approved by the PTB for 14 additional licenses but had failed to notify the City of Surrey ahead of the February 11, 2019 Council meeting.

In this regard, staff is seeking Council's approval for this late application. If approved at the February 25, 2019 Council meeting, final adoption for approval will occur at the March 11, 2019 Council meeting.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The addition of 14 taxicab licenses in the City of Surrey supports the objectives of the City's Sustainability Charter 2.0. In particular, the recommendations support the Sustainability Charter 2.0 theme of Public Safety. Specifically, the recommendations support the following Strategic Directions ("SD") and Desired Outcomes ("DO")

- Transportation Safety Dog: The transportation network supports and provides safe mobility for all ages and abilities.

CONCLUSION

Based on the above discussion, the Corporate Services Department recommends that Council approve the 14 additional licenses for Delta Sunshine Taxi (1972) Ltd.; thereby increasing the total number of Class "A" taxicab licenses in the City of Surrey from 473 to 487.

INTENT

The intent of this report is to request that Council approve the addition of 47 taxicab licenses to the City of Surrey Vehicle for Hire Bylaw.

BACKGROUND

In 1999, the *Vehicle for Hire Bylaw, 1999, No. 13610* (the "Bylaw") was approved by Council. Surrey's population has substantially increased since then, creating a steady demand over time for increased taxicab service in the City. In response to this demand, a review process was developed by the City through consultation with the taxicab industry. Under the current Bylaw, the number of vehicles which may be licensed in the City of Surrey for use as a Class "A" Taxicab may only be increased by an application to Council from the taxi industry, which would also need to be within the guidelines of the Passenger Transportation Board ("PTB").

Presently, a total of 426 taxicab licenses are authorized in the City under the current Bylaw.

DISCUSSION

In September 2018, the PTB approved a motion to allow taxi companies to expand their fleets by 15% to provide better service to the public. The following companies applied for and have been approved by the PTB for additional licenses:

Staff recommend that Council approve the 47 additional licenses as reflected in the table above. This would increase the total number of Class "A" taxicab licenses in the City of Surrey from 426 to 473.
