SUBJECT: **Supplemental Funding Request – 2019 Cultural Grants Program**

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks, Recreation & Culture Department and the Finance Department recommend that Council:

1. Receive this report for information; and
2. Approve in accordance with the Surrey Cultural Grants Program Guidelines, one supplemental grant to the Latinos in Action Society in the amount of \$4,000, as generally described in this report.

INTENT

The purpose of this report is to obtain approval for the issuance of one supplemental grant under the Cultural Grants Program (the “Program”) to the Latinos in Action Society to support hosting three Latin Summer Market Events in 2019.

BACKGROUND

At its Regular meeting on January 30, 2019, Council adopted the recommendations of Corporate Report No. R015; 2019 titled “Cultural Grants Program - 2019 Grant Allocations” and provided approval of cultural grants to ninety-seven (97) organizations totalling \$502,750. Therefore, the remaining amount of funding available for Council’s allocation for emerging projects throughout 2019 is \$113,632.

DISCUSSION

Since the initial intake, the City has received one supplemental grant application. Following is a summary of the one supplemental grant application received:

Latinos in Action Society

Latinos in Action Society has applied for funding to support the presentation of three Latin Summer Markets. These neighbourhood markets will take place in Whalley on the City-owned vacant green space at Grosvenor Road and Hilton Road, adjacent to 108 Avenue and King George Boulevard. The planned events will take place in June, July and August, and will feature local arts and crafts, live music and family activities.

Evaluation of Application

The application was reviewed by the City staff members of the Evaluation Committee using a point rating system against the following Program criteria:

- Merit of the initiative for which grant funding is requested;
- Potential community impact of the initiative; and
- Health and capacity of the applicant organization to carry out the initiative.

Based on their evaluation, the Evaluation Committee recommends that Council approve under the Cultural Grants Program one supplemental grant totalling \$4,000.

Status of Program Funding

Following is a summary of the 2019 Cultural Grant Program funding allocation to date:

*available funding includes the approved annual grant budget and unallocated funding carried forward from previous years.

Appendix “1” attached to this report provides information on the status of funding related to the Cultural Grants Program, based on the assumption that Council will approve the recommendation outlined in this report. The balance of available funds will be retained as a contingency for extemporaneous grants and as a contingency.

FUNDING

Distributing the Cultural Grants

In accordance with the Program Guidelines and subject to approval of the grants by Council the applicant will receive eighty percent (80%) of the approved grant funding up front with the remaining balance to be forwarded to the applicant upon the receipt and acceptance by the City of a final report submitted by the applicant that demonstrates that the work or activity for which the grant was awarded has been duly completed.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The work of the Cultural Grants Program supports the objectives of the City's Sustainability Charter 2.0. In particular, this work relates to Sustainability Charter 2.0 theme of Education & Culture. Specifically, this project supports the following Desired Outcomes ("DO") and Strategic Direction ("SD"):

- Arts and Heritage DO7: An enviable and vibrant arts and heritage sector contributes to Surrey's citizen engagement, enrichment, economy, community livability and civic pride.
- Arts and Heritage DO9: Surrey supports and celebrates its diverse artists, cultures and community heritage through inclusive festivals, programming and events.
- Arts and Heritage DO12: Surrey nurtures a unique participatory community-based arts scene.
- Arts and Heritage SD8: Support the growth of a diverse arts sector through the development of Surrey's cultural corridor.

CONCLUSION

The Parks, Recreation & Culture Department and the Finance Department recommend that Council approve under the 2019 Cultural Grants Program the one supplemental grant to the Latinos in Action Society in the amount of \$4,000, as generally described in this report.
