SUBJECT: 2024 Staff Inclusion Calendar

RECOMMENDATION

The Corporate Services Department recommends that Council:

- 1. Receive this report for information; and
- 2. Direct staff to publish Mayor & Council greetings through local print media advertisements in the Cloverdale Reporter, Peace Arch News, and Surrey Now-Leader for nine events, as provided in this report.

INTENT

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with information on the key cultural events and important awareness days to be celebrated as outlined in the 2024 Staff Inclusion Calendar (the "Calendar"), attached to this report as Appendix "I".

BACKGROUND

To support our strategic objective of cultivating a safe, desirable and engaging workplace, the City of Surrey engages staff in a variety of inclusion initiatives each year to raise awareness of important dates and cultural events observed in our community. These initiatives are carried out in the spirit of our City of Surrey values which include:

- Community: we care about and contribute to the broader well-being of the community, we strive to make Surrey a great place our citizens to live, work, play, invest, and raise a family;
- **Innovation**: we welcome change. We actively look for leading-edge initiatives and welcome new approaches and original thinking. We are committed to continuous improvement; we recognize all experiences as important learning opportunities;
- **Teamwork**: we support each other. We trust each other. We respect each other. We take a City-wide view of the challenges we face. We value everyone's ideas;
- **Integrity**: we are honest. We are accountable for our decisions. We meet our commitments. We are forthright in our communications. We understand and comply with all laws, regulations and policies; and

• **Service**: customers are important to us, we want to help our customers, we seek to understand our customers' needs and actively work to achieve responsive, balanced solutions.

Several of the City's inclusion initiatives are linked to the Calendar celebrating key cultural events and important awareness days. These events are typically recognized through a variety of communication initiatives and staff events at City Hall.

The City seeks input from staff to identify the events to be recognized and to determine appropriate celebration standards.

DISCUSSION

The Calendar provides Council with information on the key cultural events and important awareness days to be celebrated in 2024.

As outlined in the Calendar, the City will be holding four in-person staff events at City hall to celebrate Pink Shirt Day, Canadian Mental Health Week, Diwali and Christmas. All events will be recognized through one or more of the City's staff communication channels as described in Appendix "I" (e.g., CityNet intranet, CityNet E-card, City Hall Event, Staff E-Newsletter). The City's major festivals, such as Surrey Canada Day and Surrey Fusion Festival, will be promoted to staff via the same communication channels.

There are two new additions to the 2024 Calendar: International Overdose Awareness Day and Autism Awareness Month. International Overdose Awareness Day will fall on August 31. This is a global event to raise awareness of overdose, reduce the stigma of a drug-related death, and to remember those who have died or suffered an injury as a result of a drug overdose. Autism Awareness Month will be held during the month of October. The City recognizes that our population includes people who have Autism or have family members that fall within the Autism spectrum. This month will provide staff the opportunity to learn more about autism and increase acceptance and support for Autistic people.

Staff will continue to review the impact of these events to ensure they best meet the City's commitment of having engaged, welcoming and knowledgeable staff.

Option to Publish and Announce Mayor and Council Greetings in Local Print Media and Radio

Mayor and Council may opt to share its greetings with the community through local print media advertisement for nine events, also reflected in Appendix "I". Accordingly, the Mayor and Council greetings would be published in the Cloverdale Reporter, Peace Arch News, and Surrey Now-Leader at a cost of \$3,000 for each greeting. In addition, greetings for Vaisakhi and Diwali would be published in the Indo Canadian Voice at a cost of \$1,000 for each greeting and announced on RedFM radio at a cost of \$100 for each announcement. The total cost to publish and announce greetings in all community papers and radio will be \$29,900. An extra \$10,000 will be budgeted for additional greetings as directed by Mayor & Council.

Funding to publish and announce greetings is available in the Mayor and Council's Operating Budget.

CONCLUSION

This report provides information regarding key cultural events and important awareness days to be celebrated as outlined in the 2024 Staff Inclusion Calendar. In addition, and as an option reflected in the recommendations of this report, Council may direct staff to publish Mayor & Council greetings through local print media advertisements in the Cloverdale Reporter, Peace Arch News, and Surrey Now-Leader for nine events, as provided in this report.
