BLOOM & FRUITS

Yellow daisy-like flowers bloom in June-July followed by seed heads in late summer.

WILDLIFE VALUE

Flowers are an important source of pollen and nectar for many species of bees, hoverflies and other beneficial insects. Seeds are eaten by songbirds, including many sparrows, in fall.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Spreads readily by underground rhizome, covering lots of territory quickly. An excellent plant to cover a large area in a sunny area with free draining soil. Dried seed heads can be left on plants as they will provide food for songbirds in the fall.
