## MAIL BALLOT VOTING

### REQUESTING A MAIL BALLOT PACKAGE:

Mail ballot voting is available to all Barnston Island eligible voters for the office of School Trustee for Trustee Election Area 1 of School District No. 36 (Surrey). Submit an application through the City's website at [surrey.ca/votebymail](https://surrey.ca/votebymail). Mail ballot packages will be mailed until Wednesday, October 5, 2022. After October 5, packages will only be available by picking up from City Hall. The last day to submit an application to vote by mail is Wednesday, October 12, 2022.

Eligible voters admitted into hospital may request a mail ballot until 12:00pm on Saturday, October 15, 2022, at the discretion of the Chief Election Officer. Contact [mailballot@surrey.ca](mailto:mailballot@surrey.ca).

To be counted, your mail ballot package must be received by the Chief Election Officer no later than 8:00pm on Saturday, October 15, 2022 of General Voting Day.

# NOTICE OF ADVANCE VOTING

FOR BARNSTON ISLAND, TRUSTEE ELECTION AREA 1, SCHOOL DISTRICT NO.36 (SURREY)

## ELECTOR REGISTRATION

If you are not on the list of electors, you may register at the time of voting by completing the application process at the voting place and making a declaration that you meet the requirements to be registered as set out below:

### RESIDENT ELECTORS:

To register as a resident elector you must:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day October 15, 2022;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- be a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration;
- be a resident of Barnston Island within Trustee Election Area 1 of School District No. 36 (Surrey); and
- not be disqualified from voting in an election and not otherwise disqualified by law.

### NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY ELECTORS:

To register as a non-resident property elector you must:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day October 15, 2022;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- be a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration;

- be a registered owner of real property on Barnston Island in Trustee Election Area 1 of School District No. 36 (Surrey) for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration;
- not be entitled to register as a resident elector;
- not be disqualified from voting in an election and not otherwise disqualified by law; and
- not registered as a non-resident property elector in relation to any other parcel of real property in the City of Surrey or Barnston Island.

In addition, for non-resident property electors:

- The only persons who are registered owners of the property, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust.
- If more than one individual is a registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the individual owners, register as a non-resident property elector.

In order to register at the time of voting:

- **Resident electors** must produce 2 pieces of identification (at least one with a signature). Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity.

- **Non-resident property electors** must produce 2 pieces of identification (at least one with a signature) to prove identity, proof that they are entitled to register in relation to the property, and, if there is more than one owner of the property, written consent from the majority of the property owners.

### TYPES OF DOCUMENTS THAT WILL BE ACCEPTED AS IDENTIFICATION

1. a Driver's Licence;
2. an Identification Card such as
  - i. a photo BC services card;
  - ii. a non-photo BC services card;
3. an Owner's Certificate of Insurance and Vehicle Licence issued by ICBC
4. a BC CareCard or BC Gold CareCard;
5. a Ministry of Social Development and Economic Security Request for Continued Assistance Form EA181;
6. a Social Insurance Number card;
7. a Citizenship Card;
8. a real property tax notice;
9. a credit card or debit card; or
10. a utility bill, (such as electricity, natural gas, water, telephone or cable services).

An election official may also accept other forms of identification that provide evidence satisfactory to the election official (e.g., a valid passport).
