**QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

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

A backyard garden can produce lots of fresh, organic vegetables. You can also plant in window boxes, containers and hanging planters.


*Plant some of the vegetables in the window boxes. Veggies are just as nice as flowers AND you can eat them.*
