A. DELEGATIONS

1. Marnie Apsouris

Ms. Marnie Apsouris was in attendance to request a by-law that will clearly outline hours of outdoor operation for commercial properties.

Ms. Apsouris advised:

- That she lives in a town home adjacent to the Keg Restaurant at 100 Avenue and 152 Street.
- That for the past three years she has been dealing with the Liquor Licensing Board and the City of Surrey By-law Enforcement Department regarding noise problems at the Keg.
- That there was a recent incident of the Keg being fined \$5,000 by the Liquor Control Board for a breach.
- That the noise level is intolerable because the outdoor patio operates until 2 or 3 a.m.
- That her family suffers from fatigue resulting from lack of sleep, and that this can affect their health.
- That the Keg has a Class B liquor license, which allows liquor service until 1:30 a.m. with patrons staying until 2:00 or 3:00 a.m.
- That following closing at 2:00 or 3:00 a.m. staff do the clean up, and often have after hours parties.
- That this affects the residents' ability to live peaceably in their home.
- That she has kept a noise log, which has been given to the By-Law Enforcement office.
- That noise abatement By-laws are ineffective.
- That the City of Vancouver has a workable By-law for outdoor patios and their hours of operation.
- That Council should review this and look at enacting a similar By-law.

• That she is not asking that the patio be closed down during prime working hours, but perhaps a 10:00 p.m. closing with patrons off the patio by 11:00 or 12:00.

Ms. Apsouris concluded by asking Council to do a review of the By-laws and look at enacting a by-law similar to that in the City of Vancouver.

It was Moved by Councillor Higginbotham

That the matter be referred to the Public

Safety Committee for a recommendation back to Council.
