Al Kersey, Project Director, 2004 Optimist International U-18 Curling Championship was in attendance to make a presentation regarding the 2004 Optimist International U-18 Curling Championship and the potential community impact.

Al Kersey provided the following comments:

- That he is the Assistant Commissioner with the Optimist Junior Interclub Curling League.
- That they are hosting the Optimist International U-18 Curling Championships to be held at Cloverdale and Langley April 1 to 4, 2004.
- That his purpose in speaking to Council is to build community awareness and encourage networking through contacts for the sport of curling.
- That curling is a growing sport and important to youth in terms of providing values, relationships and purpose.
- That the Optimist International organization is a large service organization with approximately 160,000 members.

- That their motto was changed from "Friend of Juvenile Delinquents" to "Friend of Youth".
- That the organization fundraises for victims of childhood cancer, oratorical tournaments, World Junior Golf championships and their purpose is to help our most valuable asset: children.
- That they offer bike safety and "Stay-in-School" programs.
- That, locally, the organization has sponsored "Walk for Youth" fundraisers for charity; supported youth teams, scouting groups, essay contest, dry grad events, and the "Trauma Teddy Bear" program.
- That the Optimist Junior Curling Team has grown to 54 teams (from Seattle to Gibsons).
- That sports bags and crests are provided those who sign up with the organization and pennants are provided for various events.
- The upcoming tournament in Cloverdale is a five-game round robin with play-offs.
- That there would also be a National Development Training camp on March 6, 2004 with individuals from the Olympic Training Centre helping out.
- That the organization appreciates the City's community grant of \$1,000 this year.
