Comments on the "Metro Vancouver 2040 - Shaping our

Future" February 2009 Draft of the Proposed Metro

Vancouver Regional Growth Strategy

The General Manager, Planning and Development submitted a report to:

- Provide an overview of the most recent draft of the proposed Metro Vancouver Regional Growth Strategy (RGS), which the Metro Vancouver Planning Committee has referred to member municipalities and to the public for consultation; and
- Identify key concerns with respect to the RGS from the perspective of the City of Surrey, to be forwarded to Metro Vancouver staff for consideration in

preparing the final draft of the RGS for review by the Metro Vancouver Board.

The General Manager, Planning and Development was recommending approval of the recommendations outlined in his report.

In considering this report, Council had the following further comments:

- The draft document appears to have lost the concepts of "complete communities". There is a need to ensure the distribution of jobs to retain the concepts of building complete communities through the Region.
- Concern is reiterated with the introduction of the Industrial and the Industrial/Commercial designations in the draft Growth Strategy. It was observed that low density, single use industrial areas, where there is no activity in the evenings, have been the target of vandalism, break ins and other security issues, a mix of uses is at times appropriate.
- The Regional Growth Strategy should contain policies to ensure the provision of transit service in advance of higher densities and initiatives, such as the reduction of parking standards, to ensure it is successful.
- The document does not sufficiently address the pressing issue of financial sustainability for municipalities.
- The proportion of affordable rental units to be provided is not realistic given the housing market and the role of Surrey as a provider of affordable ownership accommodations.
- The proposed "parcel based" mapping is a level of control over land use which is beyond the Region's ability to enforce.
- The draft Regional Growth Strategy generally does not adequately address the issues of the high growth municipalities.

- 1. Receive this report as information; and
- 2. Direct staff to forward a copy of this report and the related Council resolution to Metro Vancouver as Surrey's comments regarding the document entitled "Metro Vancouver 2040 Shaping our Future" and request that these comments be taken into account in preparing the final draft of the Regional Growth Strategy.
