In attendance before Council to present the draft Master Plan for a new community park named Bose Forest Park in West Cloverdale.

The following comments were made:

- Bose Forest Park is a new community level park in West Cloverdale south of 64 Avenue. It is a 7.5 hectare (18.3 acre) portion of the former Bose farm, adjacent to the Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR), and surrounded by a residential neighbourhood.
- An environmental assessment of the park site was conducted. A majority of
 the site is a mature forest of trees that are 80 years or older. There is a variety
 of wildlife species and the forest is home to a unique swamp environment, with
 an intermittent stream that drains into the Serpentine River.
- Phase I of the project was initiated in April 2014 and began with comprehensive community engagement. Feedback from public consultation indicated a desire to acknowledge the Bose Farm history and a preference to retain the natural character of the forest. Concerns were expressed regarding privacy of adjacent residents from park pathways as well as parking and traffic.
- The top five desired amenities from the public are pathways and trails, natural enhancement, viewpoints, nature playground and interpretive signage. A parking lot is also a popular amenity.
- Pending approval from Council, detailed design will begin with construction beginning in summer 2015.

Two concept options were developed:

PARK OPTION A

- This option focuses on the historical context of the Bose family farm with the concept centred on "Bose Walk", a broad central forest walkway with a number of picnic areas and activity sites, and leading to "Homestead Farm" with a community garden, traditional display garden and an orchard.
- o A large gravel pathway leads to a viewpoint over the Serpentine Valley.
- o This option has a parking lot with 16 spaces.

PARK OPTION B

- o This option emphasizes environmental stewardship and education.
- There are trails with boardwalks and viewpoints through the swamp area of the park, interpretive signage, picnic areas and a nature playground.
- O This option also has a small parking lot with 16 spaces.
- The preferred concept plan draws from both options with a focus on retention of natural forest area, boardwalks and trails, interpretive signage, viewpoints, and picnic areas.
- Plans for a small parking lot at the southeast corner will supplement the 40 on-street parking spaces, and would include a gate to address concerns regarding loitering and after hours use of the parking lot. Maximum sight lines from adjacent roads and along pathways will minimize areas of concealment.
- Pathways and viewpoints have also been placed with consideration to privacy, with setbacks from private properties.

Discussion

A brief discussion was held regarding the parking lot. Staff stated that there have been mixed views about the parking lot; adjacent residents were concerned about the impact. Moving forward, a small parking lot will be constructed, addressing those concerns with a gate, monitoring the parking lot, and a design which will limit loitering.
