A. DELEGATIONS

1. Laura Ballance, Board of Directors and Greg Timm, Chair Americas Olympic Qualifier for Softball

The delegation provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding the results of the Americas Olympic Qualifier Softball Event and highlighted the following information:

- The event had over 20 local, national and international media partnerships, including CBC Sports, ESPN, Global Television, TSN Radio, SportsNet Radio and Black Press. Over 192 million people were able to view the game through the media partnerships, including a live-stream from CBC television.
- 10 teams from the Americas participated in the tournament and over 225 volunteers worked 8,500 hours to stage the event. There were 35,000 spectators and 1500 new stories generated. The tournament resulted in over 10,000 overnight room bookings across the city.

The delegation provided a PowerPoint presentation with an update on hospital projects in the South Surrey area and highlighted the following information:

- Peace Arch Hospital was the first hospital in Surrey, opened in 1954 with 47 community beds. The hospital has since expanded to 481 beds with 1800 staff and 14 physicians. The hospital currently serves over 110,000 residents in White Rock and South Surrey.
- The Peace Arch Hospital Foundation was established in 1988 to focus on both the hospital campus and surrounding community. The Foundation

was one of the first hospital foundations in Canada to receive Imagine Canada accreditation.

- Peace Arch Hospital is currently undergoing a site-wide redevelopment, including a new health lodge and hospice, emergency department expansion and five new operating suites. There are also investments in medical equipment, research and special projects.
- The Peace Arch Hospital Foundation supports preventative health measures in the community for mental, emotional and physical health. Projects include "Move for Life" which supports physical literacy, the Generations Playground and the distribution of Healthy Community Grants.
