B. DELEGATIONS

1. Emergency Management

Dan Barnscher, Deputy Fire Chief was in attendance to provide a presentation regarding the role of Elected Officials in Emergency Management.

He stated that the Mayor and Council's main responsibilities are to:

- provide overall emergency policy and direction to the EOC Director;
- set the expenditure limits;
- formally request outside support/resources;
- authorize the declaration and termination of "State of Local Emergency";
- provides direction for emergency public information activities;
- liaise with other levels of government;
- act as spokesman for the jurisdiction.

Further comments made were as follows:

- If an incident is regional, a PREOC staff member becomes the spokesman;
- The mayor or Acting Mayor must declare a Local State of Emergency using very specific language;
- 20,000 people have been trained on personal preparedness in Surrey (NEAT program).
