#### Item No. Poo6 Public Safety Strategy Implementation – Update 5 1. File: 7450-30

In response to Council questions regarding break and entries in Crescent Beach staff informed that the issue was not raised in community open houses. Superintendent Shawn Gill, Surrey RCMP, provided additional information regarding break and entries including: occurrences in West Cloverdale; RCMP executed a search warrant on one house in the area and break and entries have since gone down as often the work of a prolific offender; vehicle break and entries usually go up in the summer; the RCMP will deploy volunteers as part of the Lock Out Auto Crime program. The Superintendent assured Council that the analysts will review break and entry data for Crescent Beach.

Mayor Hepner informed that the message regarding integrated public safety was being well received by the community.

# 2. Item No.Poo7 Surrey RCMP Strategic Framework 2018-2022 File: 7400-01

Assistant Commissioner Dwayne McDonald, OIC, Surrey RCMP, provided a brief overview of Committee Report Poo7 - Surrey RCMP Strategic Framework 2018-2022 including:

- The Detachment has mapped out a process to develop a new long-term strategic framework based on broad input from clients and stakeholders.
- The phases of the planning process are community engagement/public consultation, situational analysis/needs identification, internal stakeholder engagement, and Officer in Charge planning workshops.
- The Detachment will engage Council and will share its results with City departments.

In response to Council questions, Assistant Commissioner Dwayne McDonald, OIC, Surrey RCMP informed that:

- This is the start of the consultation process and there will be additional meetings with Council;
- The RCMP is incorporating all available resources into the strategic planning process in line with the Public Safety Strategy;
- The strategic plan will take approximately one year to develop and will be brought back to Council once completed;
- The initial phase will be spent identifying what is important to different parts of the community and then allocating resources based on community feedback;
- The strategic plan will be approved at the Divisional level; and
- Diversity is the largest driver of this work as the strategic plan needs to reflect the diversity of the community.
