# Public Safety Performance Measure Framework File: 7450-30

The Director, Public Safety, provided a presentation regarding Committee Report Poo9 - Public Safety Performance Measure Framework including:

- Developing ways to assess the impacts and outcomes of public safety strategy initiatives.
- The Year 1 public safety scorecard will be brought forward in November, and can be used as a tool for public communication and to ensure that programs are effective.
- A gang violence action plan has been added to the Public Safety Strategy by Mayor Hepner.

In response to committee questions, staff provided information relative to: Surrey is setting the bar with these performance measurements; setting a release date for future public safety performance measure reports that aligns with year-end; measuring and reporting out on violent crime; and ensuring that the data collected is certified to global standards.
