FIRE SERVICES**P005 Opioid Responses Update**
File No. 2640-01

The Fire Chief submitted a report to update Council on several of the City of Surrey's responses to the overdose crisis. The Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief, provided a PowerPoint presentation and highlighted the following points:

- Beginning in 2016 programs were established and rolled out in 2017 to respond to issues in the City Centre with respect to homelessness, mental health, and Fentanyl use
- Established programs are collaborative with Surrey Fire Services, Surrey RCMP, Fraser Health and other community partners
- An overview of a study from the University of Fraser Valley entitled "Opioid Intervention Strategies in Surrey, British Columbia: An Evaluation of the Trends and Treatments" was provided

- Data from a number of sources including employment, health and financial data is used to establish predictability and potential points of intervention
- New intervention programming is in development and is targeted toward identified vulnerable populations
- Technology is being leveraged to identify and respond to incidents in a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach.
