There was a petition on table containing 55 signatures opposing the rezoning application and correspondence from C. and T. Lamb and Mr. and Mrs. Widemann opposing the application.

<u>Fred Ganders, 5733 Woodside Place</u>, was in attendance and commented that he had concerns regarding the loss of half-acre properties in the area. He noted there was supposed to be a buffer zone with native tree planting, however, the trees were not maintained, have since died, and been removed. He continued that he had concerns regarding future commercial use and change in neighbourhood character.

There was correspondence on table from G. and T. McLorg, A. Dickie, B. Bjarnason, D. Passmore, J. Dearman, P. MacLennan, D. Maher, S. Stevenson, C. and G. Herbers, A. Johnson, and C. Michaluk expressing concerns relative to destabilization of bank, proposed swimming pool installation, loss of view, site lines, tree cutting, fire hazard, loss of wildlife habitat, and squatters.

The Mayor noted that M. O'Neill had expressed support for the project and not wishing to speak.

<u>Brad McIntosh, 1493 – 126A Street</u>, was in attendance on behalf of himself, his wife, Mr. D. Hancock, Mr. and Mrs. Dean, Mr. and Mrs. Deslauriers, and the Friends of Ocean Park. He commented that rumours of misinformation being circulated in the neighbourhood were unfounded. He added that legal covenants were in place to protect setbacks and he had concerns relative to devaluation of his property. He stated that the proposed development lot is only 85 meters wide, far short of the recommended width. He related concerns regarding proposed setbacks, destabilization of slope due to unauthorized tree cutting.

Mr. McIntosh commented that a senior geotechnical engineer had advised him that swimming pools were not recommended for the bluff area. He then requested that the application for variances be denied; that the City of Surrey needs to follow the established setbacks established in the City's by-laws; the application for a pool should be denied; the City of Surrey needs to enforce its existing tree by-law; the City of Surrey needs to clean up the debris from the cutting at 12626 - 15 Avenue; and have the hillside replanted and given an opportunity to restablilize with trees in a timely manner.

<u>Paul LeMay, 14480 – Malabar Crescent, White Rock, B.C.</u>, was in attendance and commented that he had concerns regarding the increased risk of land slides due to slope destabilization resulting from unauthorized tree cutting; train derailments; and hazardous material spills. He noted that he represented the Semiahmoo Peninsula Society for Citizens and then related that there had been 12 major slide incidents to date along the BNSF railway.

<u>Dr. Kim Deslauriers, 12638 - 15 Avenue</u>, was in attendance and commented that Mr. McIntosh's lawyer forwarded a letter to Mr. McIntosh putting him on notice for providing information to neighbours. She continued that in 2004, Mr. and Mrs. Hough were invited to meet the neighbours at a social event and at that time divulged the plans for his new home. She expressed concerns regarding size and height of the proposed home, loss of sunlight, development variance permit, and variance of setbacks.

<u>Tony McLorg, 12585 - 15 Avenue</u>, was in attendance and commented that he had concerns regarding tree cutting, increased fire hazard, slope destabilization, loss of view, and application to install of swimming pool at the top of the bank.

<u>Veerle Anseeuw, 1537 - 126A Street</u>, was in attendance and commented that she had concerns regarding tree cutting, size of home, loss of wildlife, bank stability, fire safety, and good government.

<u>Paul Hough, 1401 Kerfoot Road, White Rock, B.C.</u>, was in attendance and commented that he had had swimming pools on his previous properties; properly built according to geotechnical requirements. He apologized for the cutting of the trees, adding that he was absent at the time. He noted that his intention was to build a small, properly engineered, 5200 sq.ft. home on the subject site.

<u>Clarence Arychuk, Hunter Laird Engineering</u>, was in attendance and commented that the rear-yard setback is defined by the City's Zoning By-law, however, the proximity to the ocean determines the orientation. He noted that RF-O zoning was crafted to deal with ocean bluff buildings providing caps limiting building size. He added that front and back setbacks would generally be 25 feet, however, side yards could be 1.2 meters. He continued that the proposed two-storey house would be oriented east/west and the setback increased moving the house forward on the property to a point still safe, according to geotechnical reports. He added that the house design factors in increased view corridors to the neighbours. He noted that the owners have agreed to not add landscaping of significant height that would interfere with view corridors. He continued that the proposed size of the home is smaller than the size allowed through the existing registered covenant on site.

Armando Abello, 11102 - 152A Street, representative for Nick Davis, Levelton, was in attendance and commented that his company began studying the subject site in 1994 and provided a report in 2004. He continued that the report did not address the global stability of the bluff slope and assessments were done in close vicinity to the property. He recommended that a global stability analysis be conducted as requested by the neighbours, saying that this would be a wise undertaking.

He continued that water is destructive and that an analysis would investigate ground water tables and surface runoff, which could trigger slope failure. He noted that the slope is composed of hard, silt till soil deposits, however water perching on top of this deposit may accumulate and trigger some movement. He referenced a recent incident of slope failure in North Vancouver and commented that each site has its own parameters that need to be dealt with and that water not properly contained, such as in a swimming pool, was not a good idea. He continued that a swimming pool should have a secondary containment away from the site.

<u>Rosemary Zelinka, #12, 14065 Nico Wynd Place</u>, was in attendance and commented that she had concerns regarding RF-O zoning, lack of policies and criteria against which it can be judged. She noted that she thought type of criteria would include very detailed geotechnical studies for protecting vegetation on slopes, respecting neighbourhood characteristics, and for locating buildings so as to not impact view corridors of existing buildings. She advised that this is the whole point of having an OCP and Secondary Plan as they contain guidelines to guide zoning such as this. She then noted that it was regrettable that this zone was introduced by the City 2.5 years ago without any such criteria. She continued that she was surprised Surrey did not take additional steps of making all deeply sloped areas subject to development permit application to protect against hazardous conditions and protection of natural wildlife.

She noted that this plan is used by a number of municipalities in the Lower Mainland to ensure protection of environmentally sensitive and potentially hazardous sloped areas. She added that such areas could not only be created for the Ocean Park area but for the escarpment along the Fraser River area. She stated that no alteration of land or re-contouring would be permitted to be conducted without a development permit and must include a public consultation process. She noted that surely a similar process in North Vancouver indicates greater vigilance by the City along all its steep slopes.

She added that the application the City was proposing controls building design and landscaping by restrictive covenant and that this method was not as comprehensive as development permits, which are too easily altered by agreement between staff and developers without a public consultation process. She continued that there is no inherent right to rezone on that lot; it is oddly shaped; and does not meet the requirements of the RF-O zone. She added that this is one of the few lots along the strip where there are other lots landward of this particular site. She added that there were two properties adversely affected whose residents have spoken on this problem, and that other RF-O zoning has occurred along Ocean Park Road but does not have housing so adjacent to particular properties. She pointed out that this should make a difference in Council's consideration of this application and there should be some effort on behalf of staff and the owner to change the design to ameliorate the impact. She stated that there is scope for amendments to go further as abutting properties are likely to be devalued.

She added that Council should ask for better diagrams as to how the current house impedes the views of current property owners and ensure no greater impediment

occurs with the new house as a trade-off with a much larger house than would be allowed in the RF-O zone. She commented that a better solution for RF-O zoning would be a 330 sq.m. lot, with a 3500 sq.ft. building, which is the size of the existing building.

She noted that with regard to geotechnical studies, she was happy to see Council agreeing to further studies. She added that the studies that have been carried out have been on a superficial level, involving the study of terrain and did not include drill holes and soil testing. She commented that the consultant stated in the report that he was prepared to go to that further study if required. She stated that it is incumbent on Council to require them to go to that further level of detail. She concluded that she would suggest Council reject this application and require resubmission after the usual time prior to a new application with more geotechnical studies, different house design, and smaller house size that does not further impede views of adjacent properties.

She then recommended that Council pass a resolution according to S.929 of the *Local Government Act* that allows Council to withhold building permits by resolution so that if they are making changes to Zoning By-law or OCP, the development is further controlled. She suggested that the S.929 resolution be withheld pending preparation of development permit area for the whole of the escarpment and steep slopes of Surrey in order to protect development from hazardous conditions and protect natural environment. She added that if Council is not prepared to undertake this step, she would suggest staff be required to add to OCP policies which guide re-zonings to the RF zone, emphasizing the need to add adverse impacts on existing properties. She added that rezoning to RF-O gives considerable, density-heightened financial benefits, to be made at the expense of neighbours whose properties are adversely affected. She stated that Council should seek a balance of development, which is as fair as possible to everyone.

<u>Donna Maher, 12626 – 21A Avenue</u>, was in attendance and requested a proper copy of the site plan. She commented that she works in environmental assessment, applied economics, and environmental management. She continued that she was against the approval of the proposed construction. She added that the condition of the slope looks bad and she would like to see a geotechnical study undertaken as the condition of the bluff would directly affect the viability of what is above it. She was concerned regarding the comments related by Paul LeMay of the Semiahmoo Peninsula Citizens for Public Safety, relative to train and train track safety.

She continued that she had concerns regarding the ecological sensitivity of the bluff; public safety; stability of neighbours' lands; landslides and damage to trains and tracks; caustic and toxic materials; and health risks. She added that she also had concerns regarding the proposed development footprint; earthquakes; and proposed installation of swimming pool. She suggested that the application be resubmitted with the proper information.

<u>Jacquie Stinson, 1654 - 127 Street</u>, was in attendance and commented that she had concerns regarding the installation of a pool, tree cutting, and size of proposed home.

<u>Pierre Rovtar, 18665 – 56A Avenue</u>, was in attendance and commented that the RF-O zone was designed to maximize return on development dollars. He then added that Council should err on the side of caution in consideration of global warming that 90% of scientists agree is occurring. He noted that climatologists predict wetter winters and he then requested a denial of the variance until more information is brought forward.

<u>Thomas Dean, 12590 - 15A Avenue</u>, was in attendance and commented that he owns a bluff property and was also a survivor in the Mississauga disaster. He continued that his property, during last year's rainy season, experienced a small slide due to heavy rains. He added that a geotechnical engineer from Thurber Engineering was commissioned by the City of Surrey to evaluate the numerous slides on the bluff, which numbered approximately 16 last year.

He noted that he had the opportunity to speak with the geotechnical engineer as he had been interested in installing a swimming pool on his property. He stated that the engineer had advised him that it would not be wise to install a water feature on any bluff properties. He added that he was also told that if it had to be done, it should be a very minimal feature and should be setback ten to fifteen meters.

He continued that the City closed down the "1001 steps" due to instability of the area and made repairs. He stated that these steps are located two doors from the property in question. He then commented that when he learned of the proposed application, he followed up with a geotechnical engineer, who confirmed that installation of a pool was not a wise idea. He noted that the value of all bluff properties would be at risk and reports from Levelton Consultants Ltd. present conflicting information on pool installation.

He stated that he was pleased to hear the City was going to hire an independent engineering firm to have a look at this property as it relates to the installation of a water feature near the bluff.

<u>Pierre Deslauriers, 12638 - 15 Avenue</u>, was in attendance and commented that he had concerns regarding preservation of site lines, size of development, and loss of views.

<u>Ian Mansfield, 12587 – 55A Avenue</u>, was in attendance and commented that he had a geotechnical report undertaken himself when he purchased his property seven years ago. He then noted that upon hearing information presented at the public hearing, he no longer supported the proposed rezoning application and requested the City to require the applicant to develop the property in accordance with existing zoning. He added that Mr. Hough has a right to build a home, based on zoning on the property when he bought it, and that area residents should be good neighbours in working this matter out.
