Item No. R143 Amendment to Fire Service By-law No. 10771 File: 3900-20

The Fire Chief submitted a report advising that the City of Surrey Fire Service conducts approximately 7,000 safety inspections annually, of which approximately 50 % require re-inspection. The primary reason for re-inspection is due to poor workmanship applied to the servicing of fire protection equipment. It has become apparent that fire protection service companies in some cases do not employ trades qualified personal to repair or maintain fire protection equipment. We are proposing that a minimum standard of qualification be required to repair and or maintain fire protection equipment within the City of Surrey. This will provide a better assurance of an adequate level of safety to the citizens of Surrey that is currently compromised due to the lack of any required measure of competency of fire protection service technicians. This report seeks Council approval to ensure that an adequate standard of inspection and testing of fire protection equipment is conducted by Fire Protection Service Technicians by requiring the certification of the technicians to an acceptable standard.
