DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT

There was correspondence on table from R. Woods and S. Wass expressing concerns relative to character retention of homes, access and egress, secondary suites, parking, tree preservation, and storm and sanitary sewers.

The Mayor noted that R. Bullinger and J. Bullinger had expressed opposition to the proposed project, and not wishing to speak.

<u>Seth Wass, 16185 - 16A Avenue</u>, was in attendance and commented that he had concerns relative to the lot size on the cul-de-sac portion. He stated he would not like to see two storey homes developed, and noted concerns regarding access and egress to 16 Avenue, secondary suites, parking, tree preservation, and storm and sanitary sewers.

<u>Clarence Arychuk, Hunter Laird Engineering</u>, was in attendance and commented that the previous speaker was commenting on a portion of the property that is already zoned correctly and was not part of this application. He noted that there would be a frontage road parallel to King George Highway and that parking would be provided on the lots.

The Notice of the Public Hearing was read by the City Clerk. The location of the property was indicated to the Public Hearing.

There was correspondence on table from R. May of Campbell Froh May & Rice LLP expressing concerns of proximity of development to nearby poultry farm, and from R. Aback expressing concerns with littering, and security.

Shawn Heppell, 1765 Lefeuvre Road, Abbotsford, was in attendance and noted that he was speaking on behalf of Maxine Heppell of 2825 – 192 Street. He then commented that they were opposed to the proposed rezoning application. He continued that the Heppell family had operated a farming operation of poultry immediately across 28 Avenue for 30 years. He advised that in 2001, a building permit had been permitted to the Heppells to build a poultry barn and the Board of Variance had granted a variance to site the barn closer to the road. He added that the BOV had noted that the road had been dedicated for 100 years and was treed only. He continued that the barn is less than 100 feet from this proposal; that they had invested over \$8 million in this project, which was developed with that variance to mitigate any impact on neighbours. He added that they propose to double the operation and that the proposed development would impact on their business plans, financially. He noted that the barn features 30 fans at 36 inches in diameter, moving in excess of 20,000 cfm. He advised that the fans are not noisy, but the smell of the poultry operation could create a negative impact.

Gerry Olma, 3889 159 Street, representative for Campbell Station Centre Ltd., was in attendance and commented that they are proposing a commercial centre; a use that is appropriate to Campbell Heights and industrial park. He continued that there could be many people attending the industrial park in the future, who will be travelling by car; those vehicles must be attended, and convenience must be provided to these workers by way of a gas station. He advised that the proposed design is appropriate and that some retail should be included for future needs.

WHEREAS the Minister Responsible for the National Homelessness Initiative on October 26, 2006, indicated support for extending and expanding federal homelessness programs;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of Surrey urges the Government of Canada to renew and expand the National Homelessness Initiative, and requests that:

- (a) the federal government make an ongoing commitment to a renewed National Homelessness Initiative in partnership with provincial governments, municipal governments, and community representatives;
- (b) the federal government commit to providing bridge funding to ensure that the many important programs that have been developed by communities with federal funds are allowed to continue while this renewed National Homelessness Initiative is being developed; and
- (c) the federal government introduce a comprehensive national housing strategy that includes a significant housing supply program." File: 5080-01
