B. **DELEGATIONS - PRESENTATIONS**

The General Manager of Parks Recreation and Culture provided a video presentation from staff showcasing the strong programming for the coming year and the strong support that Surrey has provided to the development of Culture and the Arts over the last number of the years and the video will showcase some of the events and programming that resulted in the City winning the award of Cultural Capital of Canada.

1. Lower Mainland South Coast Region **BC Hydro**

Ken McKillop, Snr Field Manager, Field Operations, Bob Saunders, Snr Engineer, Distribution Engineering, Victoria Smith, Manager, Outage Communication Initiative, Gregg Hallaway, Manager, and John Monk, of Vegetation Management, and Arlene Shwetz, Manager, Community Relations, Lower Mainland South Coast Region, BC Hydro were in attendance to present strategies for addressing power outages that occur as a result of windstorms in Surrey and any enhancements to these strategies that are being considered to eliminate the number of outages and to expedite the repairs to re-establish hydro service more quickly. Following are comments provided:

- There is a requirement by the BC Utilities Commission that requires us to review what had happened during the 06/07 storm and what BC Hydro can do better.
- BC Hydro has held meetings with over 41 communities across BC and there . has been positive feedback from the stakeholders.
- During the storm of last year there were 240,000 customers without power is a . unprecedented number of outages during the storm that started in November and lasted through to January.
- Public and worker safety if the primary responsibility of BC Hydro. BC Hydro first tries to restore power in generation and transmission facilities that are necessary to supply customers. The following are the next priorities: Communication facilities for civil authorities; Hospitals; Critical customers which include: police, fire, ambulance, and municipal emergency centres; facilities as directed by municipal, provincial and federal authorities; utility facilities, gas, sewer, water, telephone, cellular; designated emergency

reception centres (schools, civic centres); identified special needs customers; general commercial, industrial, residential customers.

- BC Hydro measures reliability in terms of the number of interruptions a customer experiences and the duration of those interruptions. While we plan for maintenance and operation of our power lines and other infrastructure, there is always the reality of unpredictable factors that lead to unplanned power interruptions.
- Surrey is served by nine substations and 71 distribution line feeders: Cloverdale (CDL); Scott (SCT); Harvie Road (HRD); Strawberry Hill (SYH); McLellan (MLN); Surrey (SRY); Nicomekl (NKL); Whalley (WHY); White Rock (WRK). BC Hydro serves 142,251 customers in Surrey.
- The customer hours lost by cause are mostly due to adverse weather; other causes would be trees, there are also MVA and equipment failure.
- Improvements to the Surrey Circuit System include:
 - o Installation new Strawberry Hills standby feeder (\$630K)
 - Installed bird protection in the Nicomekl are of 40 Avenue west of King George Highway (\$50K)
 - Installed Hendrix cable in Whalley area near Green Timbers Urban Forest along 96 Avenue (\$180K)
 - Extended the Whalley standby feeder as backup near W. Whalley Ring Road (\$100K).
 - Installed Hendrix cable at 20th Avenue and 128 Street (\$80K).
 - In Strawberry Hill area installed bird protection (\$50K)
 - o Installed Hendrix cable at 128 Street and Marine Drive (\$70K)
 - Replace switchgear at Morgan Creek (\$80K)
 - Installed Hendrix cable at Nicomekl and White Rock (\$1610K)
 - o Installing switchgear at Central City Mall in Whalley (\$80K)
 - McLellan: tie and recloser (automatically restores the network) work at Campbell Heights Business Park and Cloverdale Residential area.
 - Install two reclosers in the Harvie Road area.
- On average we spend \$800,000 per year on BC Hydro improvements.
- The vegetation program in Surrey consists of two parts there is the pruning program and the hazard trees removal program. Pruning is done on a 3-year cycle so some portion of Surrey is worked every year, the central portion south of 88 Avenue, east of 120 Street, west of 152 Street and north of 16 Avenue will be done in 2007/08. \$1.3 million has been spent on pruning the last 4 years. Hazard tree removal is done annually. \$428K has been spent on hazard tree removal in the past 4 years.
- Tree failure analysis of the Nov/Dec 2006 store: BC Hydro analysed 376 tree failures which struck the power lines in 9 communities on Vancouver Island and 13 communities in the Lower Mainland. Two thirds of the trees that failed showed no signs of disease or structural flaws; they were healthy trees. Wind gusts combined with saturated soils caused the majority of the tree failures. Wind gusts at Race Rocks south of Victoria were 158 km/hour compared to Typhoon Frieda in 1962 had top winds gusts of 128 km/hour.
- Hydro poles are not our poles; we have a joint use agreement with Telus.
- The cost is increased 10 times to put the wiring underground, 2000 dollars a meter to go underground.
