Len Garis, Fire Chief, Gord Anderson, Deputy Fire Chief, Amanda McCormick and Darryl Plecas were before Council to make a presentation regarding the Fire Prevention/Homesafe Program, following are comments provided during their delegation:

- Approximately 4 years ago the Surrey Fire Service began to look at what we do in the areas of fire prevention and public education for effectiveness.
- A decision was made to move in a different and new direction specific to home safety in our City, as a result the Home Safe program was developed.
- A decision was made to take a very strategic new approach to fire prevention and Public Education practices to ensure we were on the mark and current in our efforts would not lack meaningful purpose.
- Before SFS could be strategic in developing future practices SFS would need to clearly understand our fire history. Consequently, the SFS and UFV School of Criminology, Dr. Plecas and Amanda McCormick partnered to comprehensively analyze 20 years of Surrey Fire History. In all 4,758 fires were analyzed from 1988 to 2007.
- A critical find in regard to residential fires was the very disconcerting number
 of non-functioning smoke alarms from actual fire incidents. Because smoke
 alarms cannot actually prevent any fire from occurring, their presence in
 working condition cannot be overstated.
- Home Safety inspections will aggressively focus on the existence of working smoke alarms, including the ability to immediately provide and install one.
- Fire companies will, in the future, have smoke alarms for installation even at incident calls on a 24/7 basis.
- Home safety inspections will be available to Surrey residents beginning in March of 2009.
- Posters and rack cards as seen here will be strategically located throughout the
 city in facilities visited by seniors and families. Information of how to request
 a home inspection will be available on these cards and the City of Surrey
 website.
- Surrey Fire Services expect that word of mouth will probably be a leading method of advertising this service.
- A downloadable home safety checklist will be made available on the City's Website for year round use.
