1. Surrey Zoning By-law, 1993, No. 12000, Amendment By-law, 2009, No. 17042

PROPOSAL:

To rezone the property from "Intensive Agriculture Zone

(A-2)" to "Business Park 1 Zone (IB-1)"

DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT

To vary "Surrey Zoning By-law, 1993, No. 12000", as amended, Part 47A, Sections E, F and H.1, as follows:

- (a) To reduce the minimum southerly side yard setback from 3.6 metres (12 ft.) to 3.0 metres (10 ft.);
- (b) To reduce the minimum rear yard setback from 7.5 metres (25 ft.) to 0 m;
- (c) To increase the maximum lot coverage from 60% to 65%; and
- (d) To reduce the required parking spaces from 121 to 63 for a cold storage warehouse.

The purpose of the rezoning and development variance permit is to permit the development of an industrial cold storage warehouse.

The Notice of the Public Hearing was read by the City Clerk. The location of the property was indicated to the Public Hearing.

<u>Kris Thomasson, 19065 – 52 Avenue</u>, stated the following: opposed to this proposal as it will be removal of agricultural land from Surrey; BC is the best place to grow food and farm land should not be removed from agricultural areas; this property is A-2 land used for intensive agricultural for larger farms with animals and greenhouses; concerned for produce, dairy and meats in the grocery stores being imported from other countries and not grown locally; concerned that the cold storage will be utilized for storage of foreign foods and not locally grown foods.

<u>William Reid, #35 – 16888 – 8o Avenue</u>, stated the following: the main source of cold storage is from the local blueberry farms; this proposal is an economic opportunity for the City; and as a representative on the Economic Stability Task Force he suggests that Council support the cold storage proposal. In response to a question he advised that the storage is both cold and frozen storage.

Cory Flockstra, 2967 – 188 Street, stated the following: he owns the turkey operation to the south of the proposal; he is concerned for the removal of the buffer area between his site and the adjacent site, and for the impact that construction will have on his turkey operation; he hopes that the road will be upgraded as there will be an increase in traffic. He concern is for the time of construction and the impact on the turkeys, as turkeys are known for stampeding. The exhaust fans from the turkey operation are facing north not south.

In response to a question, staff advised that the building will provide a buffer to the turkey operation to the south of the subject site, the building will be sited 3 meters from the property line, therefore there will be no parking and loading at the south side of the building, the building will act as noise attenuation.

Murray Wisenberger, 12785 Crescent Road, stated the following; concern for 80% of the trees being removed from the site, most of which will be large fir trees, only 18 trees will be retained on site; there will be an increased pressure on the wildlife in the area; there will be 263 trees removed and 18 to be retained, with 512 replacement trees required with only 96 being on site. He requested that Council push for a gold standard on the LEED certification. He noted that the original LAP proposed a road that would connect with Campbell Heights, South Surrey to the Abbotsford Airport. He noted that there would only be approximately 3 or 4 jobs provided per acre for this type of development.

In response to a question, staff advised that the Green City Fund is used to plant trees elsewhere in the City

Oleg Verbenkoff, Pacific Land Group, 7485 – 130 Street, stated the following: he is the agent for the project; the use of the building will be cold storage of blueberries and there may be other growers in the area, or possibly the turkeys from the adjacent property; the building will be constructed so that any noise producing activities will be on the north side of the building, there will be no exhaust fans facing south towards the turkey farm; close to 100 trees will be installed on site and will be retaining a cluster of trees at the north west corner of the site; there are not many fir trees on site. In response to a question, the agent advised that if final approval is provided on December 14, then the removal of trees will be done before the new young turkeys arrive to the adjacent turkey farm, and we will try to keep the noise down and steady during construction to not disrupt the turkeys, most construction will be tilt up concrete and will become an instant barrier, ideally the building would be fully constructed by summer of 2010.

DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT

To vary "Surrey Subdivision and Development By-law, 1986, No. 8830, as amended, Part V, Section 24(a), as follows:

(a) To defer works and services along the portion of 112 Avenue.

The purpose of the rezoning and development variance permit to permit the modification of an existing motel into a 56-unit apartment complex for the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless and ancillary support services.

The Notice of the Public Hearing was read by the City Clerk. The location of the property was indicated to the Public Hearing.

Marty Vanderzalm, 10065 – 173 Street, stated the following: his property is to the north of the subject site; he has no opposition to housing the homeless, his concern is with the state of the facility; the building in its state will remain a flop house; the wood frame structure should be demolished and a proper structure developed to house the homeless

Elizabeth Model, on behalf of the Downtown Surrey Business Improvement Association, #300 – 10524 King George Highway, stated the following: if the project is safe, inclusive, healthy and economically viable for the good of downtown Surrey and produces a better and more vibrant community, then it is supported by the association; if there are issues that may arise that directly impact the community in a negative manner, then it must be reassessed and modified as quickly as possible in order to mitigate any negative impact on the direct community. In response to a question the delegation advised that the association would support a neighbourhood agreement and advisory committee being developed by the management of the facility.

<u>Jim Dorn, 13255 – 112 Avenue</u>, stated the following: his property is located opposite the rear entrance of the facility and there have been numerous issues in the neighbourhood and provided examples; concern that there is not someone that will be responsible for mitigating the neighbourhood concerns when the future issues arise; concerned that there is garbage dumping in the area and lack of sufficient lighting; concerned that a criminal element will come with the development of the facility; concerned for the safety of the children and family in the area (specifically along 112 behind the hotel); concerned for the staff levels (ie. 1 staff member for a 56 unit complex); the video camera within the site are great but will drive the criminal activities into the neighbourhood (ie. Drug dealing); potentially the area may become worse; there are a total of 35 people living there 20 of which are from New Westminster and will be returning to their facility; what recourse will the neighbourhood have from the impact of this development in their neighbourhood. He suggested the following: that a security guard be posted at the rear entrance/exit to 112 Avenue to ensure safe passage for pedestrians and that there is a constant presence there to keep the criminal aspect away; more streetlights be installed to deter criminal activity, and video surveillance be installed; he is concerned for the depreciation of property in the neighbourhood due the facility being located in the area.

<u>Tom Virk, 13047 – 112 Avenue</u>, stated the following: he had just moved into the neighbourhood and is concerned that the facility will bring with it an unwanted element in the neighbourhood.

Robert Haseley, 11313 – 133 A Street, stated the following: in the past years there have been many criminal problems in the Bolivar Heights area and the community worked hard to get the criminal aspect in control, and now the facility location will cause the criminal issues to be in the neighbourhood again.

<u>Ann Cassidy McDougall, 11375 – 133A Street</u>, stated the following: concerned that placing a high number of people that are at high risk will be the end of the

community; concerned for the staffing level and who will be housed at the facility; concerned for the due process and the notification of the application; what funding will the community receive for accepting this facility;

<u>Lee Klassen</u>, 13024 – 112 <u>Avenue</u>, stated the following: concern that the notification of the application was only 100 meters and in the local newspaper; concerned that there is an 80 year old building at the entrance to the City; she noted that there are many social services in the area already.

Carolyn Baneski, Executive Director of Fraser Side Community Services Society ('FS'), stated the following: FS will be the operator of the facility; since August FS has been operating on the site with 20 people living in one building and up to 15 in another; there is staffing on site 24 hours a day, there is a larger complement of staff on during the day than in the evenings, as there is much work done with tenants that live in the building; FS has installed and activated a security system, including 4 cameras on site; the building is oriented to provide exit/entrance to King George Highway; FS has installed fences and have control of those accessing or leaving the site; FS operates similar facilities, only 15 people will have mental health issues, the remaining tenants will be classified as 'working poor', those unable to afford market rent; most tenants stay up to 2 years and this will not be transient housing as the tenants enter into agreements with us; the tenants are from the Provincial housing registry, and there are not individuals on site that would pose a risk to children; a temporary arrangement was made when there was redevelopment being done at a site in New Westminster, the arrangement was that 20 people would live at the facility on a temporary basis and they have now all returned to the New Westminster site, the gate along 112 is a permanently locked gate and used only for emergencies; FS has security cameras that scanned the back of the site and we also provide on foot patrol of the site; there are specific rules for the site, such as no open drugs on site, no violence on site etc., we do not have control of what they may do off site; FS is committed to keeping people safe and respecting people, and we would not put an individual that was a danger to themselves and others on site, and FS screens to the fullest degree that we can screen; only 15 of those residing on site will have mental challenges and they have to register with BC Housing; renovations to date include installation of a sprinkler system, all new laminate flooring, electrical was upgraded, a new roof was installed, however we have not changed the wood structure; FS would be willing to have an Good Neighbourhood Agreement, and we would be willing to become a member of the local ratepayer's association and can look at other options as well.

Noami Brenabar, Senior Project Officer with BC Housing ('BCH'), stated the following: BCH intention when they purchased the property in March 2007 was twofold, there was yearend financial gains through the Provincial Government and there were 10 SROs that were purchased in Vancouver, and the purchase of the Howard Johnson was an attempt to try and preserve some affordable housing, and the other goal of the purchase was to house clients that were in another hotel in Surrey, where they were not being adequately served and to partner with Fraser Health; the first phase of renovation is complete on the Boulevard Court side, the 15 clients with mental health or addictions is funded by Fraser Health on an annual basis and the remainder of the clients are from the BC Housing Registry; Pedersen Place is indicated as a 'non high needs residents' and the staffing model is not in place for high needs residents, the common dominator that the residents

will have is that they cannot afford market rent; there are other developments in Surrey that are meeting the 'higher needs' clients however this is not one of them; the life and safety of the building are fine as it is however there is a voluntary second phase renovation being done.

In response to questions the delegation stated: the two storey building is the social housing building, and the one storey building 'Boulevard Court' is for the 15 individuals with mental health issues.

In response to a question, staff advised that the City does not have any interest in the property except through the approval process for the application.

<u>Alan Davis, 13583 Crestview Drive</u>, asked what guarantee is in place to ensure that the occupancy for those residents with mental health challenges does not increase.

<u>Carolyn Baneski</u>, <u>Executive Director of FS</u>, responded and stated that as long as FS is the operator the facility will not increase past 15 tenants with mental health challenges; FS has a strong philosophical base that FS does not want to recreate many institutions in one communities, and FS does not believe that the best quality of life will be obtained though a large complex with many people with mental illness, the best outcomes come from being able to provide support and having the ability to have an integrated community.
