The Notice of the Public Hearing was read by the City Clerk. The location of the property was indicated to the Public Hearing.

Council requested planning staff for clarification regarding the road dedication. Staff shared that the City requested a road dedication to ensure that the road would be publicly maintained rather than kept as a private road for strata use only.

- M. Mikan, Unit 50, 18707 65 Avenue: in favour of the development, was originally opposed. On reviewing the revised plans, he is now in favour of the development and views the changes as fair. He reviewed the drawings and sketches believe it is in keeping with the look and feel of the neighbourhood.
- <u>R. Frank, 6462 188 Street</u>: is opposed to the development proposal and expressed the following concerns: traffic, parking, and compromise to the form and character of the neighbourhood.
- M. Krenus, 6472 188 Street: is opposed to the development and expressed concerns regarding the proposed development is not in keeping RM15 specifications; the road dedication to the City is reducing the useable land causing increased density and traffic congestion.
- R. Bourdaise, Unit 34, 18707 65 Avenue: was originally opposed to the proposal when it was RM30. In support now, the development is good for the community. Commend the City for taking on the responsibility for road maintenance.
- <u>D. Dayton, Unit 2, 18707 65 Avenue</u>: was originally opposed to the RM30 development. Attended several Mosaic meetings, Mr. Dayton is now in full agreement with the development proposal.
- <u>B. Morris, Unit 97, 18883 65 Avenue</u>: was originally opposed to the RM30. Mosaic has done a lot of positive community consultation; Mr. Morris is now in support of the development.
- M. Carman, Unit 63, 18705 65 Avenue: opposed to the development, expressed concern regarding density associated with the RM15 zoning.
- R. Tews, 6446 188 Street: opposed to the development. Expressed concern regarding, road dedication and density.
- <u>W. Wolfe, 18 18883, 65 Avenue</u>: opposed to the development. Expressed concern regarding increased density, parking and potential traffic issues.
- <u>B. Palmer</u>, 6346 188 Street: opposed to the development. Expressed concern regarding the following: existing high volume of traffic prior to the RF15 development; decrease in property values for existing homeowners, reduced parking, need for timed signal lights. Mr. Palmer requested residential only parking signage be installed for existing residents.
- <u>J. Slarks, Unit 35, 7238 189 Street</u>: in favour of the new development. The increased density will provide more affordable housing.
- B. Reid, Unit 35, 16888 80 Avenue, on behalf of business community and Cloverdale Chamber of Commerce: recommend approval of the project. There are excellent transit options available; the C70 bus services all of Cloverdale. Development will lead to increased traffic in the area for local merchants. The Chamber of Commerce operates the Cloverdale Trolley on 64 Avenue and is strongly in support of the road being a connector.

The developer shared that geotechnical work has not been performed; however, would be done prior to final adoption at the request of staff.

<u>J. Davis, #26, 7168 – 179 Street</u>: opposed to the development. Expressed concern regarding drainage; increased density, tree removal, parking and the narrowness of the road.

R. Davis, #25, 7168 – 179 Street: opposed to the development. Expressed concern regarding the entrance and exit of the property and location of the driveway, suggested that it be relocated to a more suitable area, i.e., off of Old Yale Road. Mr. Davis noted concerns regarding drainage issues and the location of the proposed walkway.

<u>E. Lotz, 18037 - 78A Avenue</u>: opposed to the development. Expressed concern regarding density, anticipated volume of traffic and drainage.

Maciej Dembek, #135, 7136 - 130 Street: The Applicant addressed the concerns of the interveners as follows: the entry point to the development is located in an optimal location, the proponent will redevelop the pedestrian connection in partnership with the City of Surrey Parks Department. Based on community consultations, additional parking stalls were added to address visitor parking considerations. Drainage will be taken care of based on engineering specifications. The applicant noted that numerous trees were preserved; all units that abut the development to the east have the required setbacks. The units located on the southern edge interface nicely with the existing properties, associated drainage issues will be dealt with. The applicant further noted that the driveway will be incorporated as part of the multi-use pathway on the edge of Fraser as a public use feature / green buffer.
