In attendance before Council to present on World Elder Abuse Awareness Day and the Mayor's Task Force on Seniors.

The following comments were made:

- Councillor Steele introduced the delegation and noted that several individuals were in attendance today in support of the World Elder Abuse Awareness Day by wearing purple, a colour chosen specifically for this very important issue. The key objective of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD) is to raise awareness of elder abuse (which encompasses neglect and mal or mistreatment) throughout the world.
- Colleen Kerr spoke briefly about Corporate Report R108 and noted that today is an opportunity to showcase the work the City of Surrey has done in the efforts to raise awareness for senior's services, elder abuse and to allow for connections to keep people safe and healthy in the community.
- World Elder Abuse day happens every year on June 15. Each year, individuals and organizations come together to raise awareness where the whole world brings attention to the abuse and suffering that occurs with our seniors. Although there are laws that protect seniors their success can be hindered because many crimes are not reported.
- The goal of the community is to create awareness to fight elder abuse. Society's attitude toward the elderly and ageism must be modified.

E. MAYOR'S REPORT

The Mayor Watts read the following proclamation:

WORLD ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS DAY June 15, 2011

- WHEREAS June 15, 2006 was the inauguration of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day;
- WHEREAS up to ten percent of senior adults in British Columbia will at some point in time face some form of abuse;
- WHEREAS through raising awareness we are able to join communities together and show each other that we care about each other's well-being;
- WHEREAS Surrey is a city that is always at the forefront of celebrating diversity and can be a leader in bringing awareness to the abuse of seniors, and can help bring awareness to the rest of the world; and
- WHEREAS our aging population deserves the respect to have this day and these issues brought to the attention of society;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that I, Dianne L. Watts, do hereby declare the 15th of June, 2011 as "World Elder Abuse Awareness Day "in the City of Surrey, and recognize and affirm that:

- Our senior population is an important part of our society
- Senior abuse and neglect is a problem which must be addressed more often and with more seriousness
- That financial, sexual, physical and emotional abuse does occur at all age groups
- That the senior population has moulded and shaped today's world and it is our responsibility to ensure their safety and happiness during their later years;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this Council call upon other municipalities, and countries to urge them to join together as a community and world network to value, and to prevent abuse and neglect of older adults; and

(a) 2011 Honey Hooser Scholarship Award File: 0290-20 HH

The Honey Hooser fund was established in 1994 in memory of the late Doug Hooser's mother, Mrs. "Honey" Hooser, who was involved with the Peace Arch Wavers and Spinners Guild.

The Fund is used for two purposes annually. It provides for the award of a \$500.00 scholarship to a deserving student from Surrey in support of that student's continuing studies in visual, graphic or performing arts.

Mayor Watts recognized Mr. Derek Armstrong as the recipient of the 2011 Honey Hooser Scholarship.

Mr. Armstrong graduates from the Semiahmoo Secondary School this month and is enrolled in Kwantlen Polytechnical University's Access Program. His involvement in arts & crafts has been through pottery, painting and drawing. Derek eventually wishes to be accepted to Emily Carr to pursue further studies.

(b) Peace Arch Weavers and Spinners Guild File: 1850-20

The Honey Hooser fund was established to support the arts and crafts within our community. As part of this fund, a grant of \$500.00 has been provided annually to the Peace Arch Weavers and Spinners Guild to support their activities.

A letter was received, as per usual practice, from the Peace Arch Weavers and Spinners Guild explaining the intended use of the grant. This year the grant will be used for the annual Doug Hooser Memorial Lecture in September and the annual Sheep to Shawl competition held in Surrey Museum every May.

Mayor Watts presented Patricia Matthews, President of the Peace Arch Weavers and Spinners Guild with a grant of \$500.00.

3. City of Surrey Employee Memorial Scholarship File: 1770-01; 0550-20-10

Established in 2009 to honour the memory of City of Surrey employees who had passed away, Mayor and Council established the City of Surrey Employee Memorial Scholarships at Kwantlen Polytechnic University and at Simon Fraser University.

The City of Surrey Employee Memorial Scholarship awards are comprised of two \$1,000 scholarships. The Employee Memorial Scholarships are awarded to children of City of Surrey Employees who have demonstrated impressive academic and community volunteer records throughout their high school careers.
