Council requested staff to provide a report with additional detail on the sustainability of the Demonstration Rail Project and to equate a dollar value to thousands of volunteer hours associated with the work completed to-date. Staff shared that to-date there has been over 17,000 hours of highly skilled professionals (i.e., trades and engineers) volunteering their time in support of the project.

Have been running an office for 25 years in Surrey and has been in the current strata complex for 10 years; commented it was at a by-law officer's urging that he apply for the rezoning before Council. Clarified the purpose of the rezoning application is to allow the existing businesses to remain; the strata has been a little pocket by itself in an industrial area.

Mayor Watts explained that the current arrangement poses a problem with trying to manage industrial lands for industrial uses.

The applicant requested enough time to vacate the premises if the by-law amendment is not granted.
