- (g) To reduce the minimum southerly side yard setback from 7.5 metres to 6.0 metres (20 ft.) for the balconies for Buildings 5, 6 and 7; and
- (h) To reduce the minimum westerly side yard setback from 7.5 metres to 4.7 metres (15 ft.) for Buildings 7 and to 2.5 metres (8 ft.) for Building 8.

<u>T. Yzerman, 44, 7518 – 138 Street</u>: The property has a proposed greenway, would like to see a 4 m path from 94A – 96 Avenue. The delegation requested a greenway placed on the property to connect the city centre and the east / west greenway from Alex Fraser Bridge to the Golden Ears Bridge. The delegation clarified a gravel pathway would be sufficient if a paved pathway is not feasible.

Council noted prior to final adoption, a 9 foot wide statutory right-of-way would be established.

<u>Y. Rebouillat, 13866 – 94A Avenue</u>: Expressed concern regarding tree removal. Staff clarified no trees will be removed for the development.

<u>A. Vick, 14107 – 101 Avenue</u>: Thanked Council and staff for bike routes and greenways, as well as Green Timbers trail extension to Walnut Grove in Langley. Is hopeful the route will be connected into the B.C. park network in the future to create a cycling freeway to attract cycling tourism. Expressed concern regarding the proposed development and temporary land use agreement and requested the Transportation Committee review and determine the best route for vehicles, and to mitigate future land use issues / necessary connections with the traffic light at 96 Avenue.

1. Modern Building Regulatory System - Office of Housing and Construction Standards

The 2012 BC Building Code is to be introduced in early 2012 and become effective in fall 2012. Building and Safety Standards Branch has an open consultation on 'A Modern Building Regulatory System', two White Papers are also available for review http://www.housing.gov.bc.ca/mod/consult.htm and a public consultation will be open until April 15, 2012.

Council noted the proposed changes could impact some of Surrey's current bylaws; however, municipalities have a transition period to adopt the new standards and put them into practice. Staff were requested to provide a report addressing the changes and how they would affect Surrey's building codes.

2. Surrey Mayor's Cup – March 9-11, 2012

The 2nd Annual Surrey Mayor's Cup Soccer Tournament (sanctioned by BC Soccer Association) utilized all of Surrey's fields and showcased girls and boys teams from U9 to U18, attracting skills and players from Canadian and US Soccer Clubs; this year there were 3,500 participants.
