<u>D. Jack, President, Surrey Environmental Partners</u>: The delegation noted that this application is an example of "corridor creep" and expressed concern with the landscaping plan and that the corridor width is not consistent and that it might set a precedent for other further corridors in Surrey. Staff clarified that the landscaping plantings will be finalized throughout the process; as far as the width is concerned the Applicant is providing a reasonable offset amount that can be supported.

V. Blinkhorn, 165 Street & 26 Avenue: The delegation expressed concern regarding the Planning Report discussion on the Public Consultation Process relative to community associations. It noted that pre-notification letters were sent to 34 property owners and the Grandview Heights Residents Association which is now defunct, pre-notification was not sent to the Grandview Heights Stewardship Association as reported and that the Community Associations noted in the staff report were inaccurate.

The delegation requested that all pre-notifications be emailed to the Grandview Heights Stewardship Association and that if the wording in the planning reports could be re-worked that information has been "received" by the community associations rather than "supported".

<u>G. Cameron, 165 Street & 27 Avenue</u>: The delegation expressed concern regarding the tree removal associated with the proposed project, particularly that mature canopy trees are slated for removal. The delegation requested Council to raise the developer costs associated with the removal of mature trees to be in line with other larger municipalities such as Toronto.
