1. Councillor Claire Newman

4. Mayor's Working Group on Public Safety

Mayor Locke announced a Mayor's Working Group on Public Safety. The Working Group will have two key objectives:

- Collaborating in the effort to bring Surrey's RCMP Detachment to full authorized strength; and
- Helping facilitate the design and implementation of Surrey's integrated Community Safety and Well-Being Plan.

The Working Group will enhance collaboration across agencies, diverse communities, and other levels of government in order to deliver a best practice approach to policing and the creation of a safe, inclusive, and thriving City.

5. Development Process Streamlining to Mitigate Interest Rate Carrying Costs File: 4815-20

Mayor Locked recognized that there is hardship caused by the interest rate hike to both citizens and businesses. With the potential for another interest rate hike this week, the carrying costs due to the high interest rate continues to impede the goals of all levels of government from achieving affordable housing. Mayor Locke requested that the City Manager, the General Manager, Planning and Development, and the General Manager, Engineering, substantially reduce the time it takes for the City to review applications in order to decrease carrying costs. It is further requested that staff streamline building applications to support efficiencies to bring housing stock to market, that senior management provide their ideas on how to support the development of affordable housing and that further opportunities related to Bill 26 be considered to find other streamlining opportunities.

6. Semiahmoo Lacrosse U-13 A2 Boys Team and Junior Girls Team File: 8200-20

Mayor Locke congratulated the Semiahmoo Lacrosse U-13 A2 Boys Team for winning bronze and the Semiahmoo Lacrosse Junior Girls Team for winning silver in lacrosse provincial championships this past weekend. Mayor Locke further thanked head coaches Chris Sellar and Jamey Dunse, assistant coaches Councillor Hepner, Chaz Brisdale and Ryan Burns, as well as the coaches for Semiahmoo Lacrosse Junior Girls Team for a successful provincial championship.
