H. OTHER BUSINESS

1. Committee Member Updates

- Aimee Begalka: World University Service of Canada (WUSC) is an organization that assists with bringing students (as refugees) to Canada to attend post-secondary institutions in Canada. This settlement service provided also enables students to attend university. KPU intends to bring over its first student in September, 2018.
- Michelle Shaw: Through the Surrey Vulnerable Women's and Girls Working Group, a proposal was submitted to HPP (Homeless Partnering Project) to conduct research and come together with service providers and vulnerable women and girls to talk about developing a housing model that works provincially. This is geared to at risk youth and domestic violence, and sexually exploited girls.
- Yvette Guo: Parks Canada has a "learn to camp" program which engages newcomers to Canada and teaches various basic skills in camping. Three workshops are provided that address various basic skills in camping; setting up a tent, building a fire. Great to initiating the workshop series. If you know of a non-profit that works with populations that might be interested in camping this is a great partnership to explore with Parks Canada.
- Councillor LeFranc: The Fraser Region Aboriginal Friendship Centre Association will be hosting a fundraiser on November 18, 2017 – titled, "Guiding Youth Home". This event is to fundraise for youth housing. Staff will send out the details to the SPAC. The New Westminster District Labour Council will be hosting its Labour Day event at Holland Park. The Social Innovation Summit is scheduled for November 15th. Doug Saunders, author of "Arrival City" featured Surrey in the book and is the keynote speaker at the summit.
- Reminder of upcoming summer events: Surrey Museum (Metis event) on July 29 and the Fusion Festival at Holland Park on July 22/23 with Nelly Furtado performing on Saturday night.


